1 WHEREAS, studies and pilot projects have found a 2 significant curtailment of drug use among students who are 3 subject to drug testing, NOW, THEREFORE, 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: б 7 Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 1001.43, Florida 8 Statutes, is amended to read: 1001.43 Supplemental powers and duties of district 9 10 school board. -- The district school board may exercise the 11 following supplemental powers and duties as authorized by this code or State Board of Education rule. 12 (1) STUDENT MANAGEMENT.--The district school board may 13 14 adopt programs and policies to ensure the safety and welfare 15 of individuals, the student body, and school personnel, which 16 programs and policies may: 17 (a) Prohibit the possession of weapons and drugs on campus, student hazing, and other activities that could 18 19 threaten the operation of the school or the safety and welfare 20 of the student body or school personnel. (b) Require middle and high school students, as a 21 22 condition of participation in any extracurricular activity, to consent to urinalysis testing for the presence of any drug 23 24 that may pose a threat to the health or safety of the student. 25 The procedures for implementing this paragraph shall be prescribed by rules of the State Board of Education pursuant 26 27 to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54. 28 (c)(b) Require uniforms to be worn by the student 29 body, or impose other dress-related requirements, if the district school board finds that those requirements are 30 31
