FCAT for purposes of high school graduation on any of the approved alternative assessments shall satisfy the assessment requirement for a standard high school diploma as provided in s. 1003.429(5)(a) or s. 1003.43(5)(a) for the 2002-2003 school year graduating class. Prior to the application of these alternative assessments in subsequent school years, the Legislature shall review the continued use of these alternative tests.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
