    Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
    Section 1. (1) The Department of Education shall
evaluate the feasibility of providing a 10-percent salary
increase as a performance bonus to each public school
classroom teacher, as defined in section 1012.01, Florida
Statutes, in kindergarten and grades 1-12 who meets certain
criteria. In conducting this evaluation, the department must
use, but is not limited to, factors and methodology specified
in subsection (2).
(2) (a) Factors that must be used in evaluating the performance of and determining eligibility for the bonus for classroom teachers in grades 3-12 include:
1. The improvement in grade point average (GPA) for academic courses for each student in the teacher's classroom. 2. The scores on the reading and writing portions of the Florida Comprehensive Achievement Test (FCAT) for each student in the teacher's classroom.

    c. Improvement of the lowest quartile of students in
the teacher's classroom \(=33\) percent.
    2. For a teacher who teaches reading, writing,
mathematics, or science:
    a. Student GPA improvement \(=25\) percent.
    b. Student scores on the reading, writing,
mathematics, and science portions of the \(\operatorname{FCAT}=50\) percent.
    c. Improvement of the lowest quartile of students in
the teacher's classroom \(=25\) percent.
    (c) The Department of Education shall develop the
criteria for determining whether teachers in kindergarten
through grade 2 receive a 10 -percent salary increase as a
performance bonus under this section. Based on the criteria
developed under this paragraph, the department shall develop a
methodology for calculating a value-weighted performance score
for each classroom teacher in kindergarten through grade 2.
    (d) The Department of Education shall provide an
estimate of the fiscal impact of providing a 10 -percent salary
increase as a performance bonus, based on the methodology
prescribed under paragraphs (a) - (c), to each classroom

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
law.
