Florida Commission to Eliminate Minority Disparities; intent, creation, membership, standing 15 16 committees, duties.--(1) The State of Florida is comprised of a diverse 17 population of many different races, cultures, and ethnic 18 19 backgrounds. The Legislature is aware of the disparities that 20 are endured by some sectors of the state's population relating to the juvenile and adult criminal justice systems, health 21 22 care, economic development, housing, and the education system. It is the intent of the Legislature to minimize these 23 24 disparities. 25 (2) In order to facilitate the legislative intent expressed in subsection (1), there is established the Florida 26 27 Commission to Eliminate Minority Disparities, which is located 28 for administrative purposes in the Executive Office of the Governor. The commission shall independently exercise the 29 30 responsibilities assigned to it under this section. The

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               Two members from each group listed in the
    definition of the term "minority person" in section 288.703,
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    Florida Statutes, who represent all regions of the state,
    whose appointments are made with consideration of gender and
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    nationality subgroups, and who are appointed to serve a 3-year
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    term as members at large. Of these 10 members, the Governor
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    shall appoint two Asian Americans and two native Americans;
    the President of the Senate shall appoint two women and one
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   Hispanic American; and the Speaker of the House of
    Representatives shall appoint two African Americans and one
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   Hispanic American. All such appointments must be made before
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    August 1, 2004. Of the initial members of the commission, the

- Employ an executive director, who shall initially be designated by the Governor, to administer this section. The executive director shall report directly to the commission. The executive director shall be the chief administrative officer of the commission and shall be responsible for appointing all employees and staff members of the commission, who shall serve under the executive director's direction and control. The executive director shall work with the secretaries of state agencies to coordinate the efforts of employees to implement approved recommendations made by the commission.

- (a) Secure assistance from all state departments and agencies in order for the commission to avail itself of expertise at minimal cost.

- 2. Health care committee, which shall be co-chaired by the Secretary of Health or his or her designee and the Secretary of Health Care Administration or his or her designee, and shall include the chair of the Closing the Gap Advisory Committee or his or her designee.
- 3. Economic development committee, which shall be chaired by the director of the Agency for Workforce Innovation or his or her designee and shall include the chair of the Florida Advisory Council on Small and Minority Business Development or his or her designee and the president of Enterprise Florida, Inc., or his or her designee.

1 4. Education committee, which shall be chaired by the Commissioner of Education or his or her designee and shall 2 3 include the chair of the College Board or his or her designee. 5. Criminal justice committee, which shall be 4 5 co-chaired by the Secretary of Juvenile Justice or his or her 6 designee and the Secretary of Corrections or his or her 7 designee. 8 In addition to the required members specified in subparagraphs 9 10 1.-5., standing committees must have members of each of the 11 agencies represented on the commission. On each standing committee, there must also be members representing the 12 Commission on the Status of Women and the Florida Commission 13 on Human Relations. The standing committees must include 14 members from the community, who must have appropriate 15 expertise or must have received services from a department or 16 17 board that is represented on the commission. (b) The standing committees shall: 18 19 1. Make recommendations to the commission to eliminate duplication of efforts of state agencies and to foster 20 21 collaboration among community organizations and better use of 22 state and federal funds. 2. Identify the socioeconomic factors that influence 23 24 the existing disparities. 3. Review state agencies' functional plans, 25 legislative budget requests, and the master plans and policies 26 27 of the state agencies on the commission, as well as those of other boards, panels, and commissions appointed by the 28 29 Governor, and those of local school boards, for their impact

15	(a) Studying, through the efforts of the standing		
16	committees, the extent of disparities in each of the		
17	following: the juvenile and adult criminal justice systems,

22	(c) Reviewing state agency functional plans,

the commission, annual goals for the reduction of disparities.

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            (9) Beginning in 2005, the commission shall annually
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     report, no later than January 15, to the Governor, the
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     President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
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     Representatives, the chairs of the Senate Appropriations

     work of the previous year and, to the greatest extent
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     possible, shall compile and synthesize any reports used in its
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     work. The report must also include specific recommendations
     for any necessary legislative, administrative, or regulatory
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     reform and the commission's assessment of the state of
     disparities existing in the state.
