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18	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:				
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20	Section 1. Subsections (2) and (6) of section 370.14,				
21	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:				
22	370.14 Crawfish; regulation				
23	(2)(a)1. Each person taking or attempting to take				
24	crawfish with a trap in commercial quantities or for				
25	commercial purposes shall obtain and exhibit a crawfish trap				
26	number, as required by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation				
27	Commission. The annual fee for a crawfish trap number is \$125.				
28	Each trap used for taking or attempting to take crawfish must				
29	have a trap number permanently attached to the trap and the				
30	buoy.This trap number may be issued by the Fish and Wildlife				
31	Conservation commission upon the receipt of application by the				
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1 person when owner of the traps and accompanied by the payment 2 of the fee $\frac{1}{2}$ fee of $\frac{100}{100}$. The design of the applications and 3 of the trap number shall be determined by the commission. Any trap or device used in taking or attempting to take crawfish, 4 5 other than a trap with the trap number attached as prescribed б in this paragraph, shall be seized and destroyed by the 7 commission. The proceeds of the fees imposed by this paragraph 8 shall be deposited and used as provided in paragraph (b). The 9 commission may adopt rules to carry out the intent of this 10 section. 11 2. Each person taking or attempting to take crawfish in commercial quantities or for commercial purposes by any 12 method, other than with a trap having a crawfish trap number 13 issued by the commission, must pay an annual fee of \$100. 14 (b) Twenty-five dollars of the \$125 fee for a crawfish 15 trap number required under subparagraph (a)1. must be used 16 17 only for trap retrieval as provided in s. 370.143. The 18 remainder of the fees collected pursuant to paragraph (a) 19 shall be deposited as follows: 1. Fifty percent of the fees collected shall be 20 21 deposited in the Marine Resources Conservation Trust Fund for use in enforcing the provisions of paragraph (a) through 22 aerial and other surveillance and trap retrieval. 23 24 2. Fifty percent of the fees collected shall be deposited as provided in s. 370.142(5)s. 370.142(6). 25 (6) A person who takes more crawfish per boat or per 26 27 person than that number set therefor by rule of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission for recreational harvesters 28 29 within any 24-hour period by any method other than with traps or similar devices must also pay a fee of \$100 and obtain a 30 31 trap number to be displayed on his or her boat. 2

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1 Section 2. Section 370.143, Florida Statutes, is 2 amended to read: 3 370.143 Retrieval of lobster, crawfish, and stone crab traps during closed season; commission authority; fees .--4 5 (1) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission is б authorized to implement a trap retrieval program for retrieval 7 of lobster, crawfish, and stone crab traps remaining in the 8 water during the closed season for each species. The commission is authorized to contract with outside agents for 9 10 the program operation. 11 (2) A retrieval fee of \$10 per trap retrieved shall be assessed trap owners. However, for each person persons 12 13 holding a crawfish stamp number or a stone crab endorsement issued under rule of the Fish and Wildlife Conservation 14 commission, the retrieval fee shall be waived for the first 15 five traps retrieved. Traps recovered under this program shall 16 17 become the property of the commission or its contract agent, as determined by the commission, and shall be either destroyed 18 or resold to the original owner. Revenue from retrieval fees 19 20 shall be deposited in the Marine Resources Conservation Trust 21 Fund and used solely for operation of the trap retrieval 22 program. 23 (3) Payment of all assessed retrieval fees shall be 24 required prior to renewal of the trap owner's saltwater products license and stone crab and or crawfish endorsements. 25 Retrieval fees assessed under this program shall stand in lieu 26 of other penalties imposed for such trap violations. 27 28 (4) In the event of a major natural disaster in an 29 area declared by the Governor to be a disaster emergency area, such as a hurricane or major storm causing massive trap 30 31 losses, the commission shall waive the trap retrieval fee. 3
