Section 394.9084, Florida Statutes, is 19 amended to read: 20 394.9084 Pilot project; client-directed and 21 choice-based adult mental health services .--22 (1) The department of Children and Family Services 23 shall conduct develop a client-directed and choice-based pilot project in district 4 to provide mental health treatment and 24 25 support services to adults who have a serious and persistent 26 mental illness. The project shall test a payment model in which each client controls the money that is available for 27 28 that client's mental health treatment and support services. 29 (2) The department may expand the client-directed and 30 choice-based pilot project to one additional district to be

selected by the department.

and implement a client-directed and choice-based pilot project in one district to provide mental health treatment and support services for children who live at home. If established, any staff who work with children must be screened under s. 435.04. The administrative costs for conducting the projects may not be paid from funds appropriated for direct client services. Prior to expanding the current project beyond district 4 and implementing the pilot project for children, the department shall establish procedures applicable for the project sites which include:

- (a) A description of the project and its purpose;
- (b) The eligibility requirements for project participants;
- (c) The scope of services for which project funding may be used, including services provided by the administrative entity, services provided by a behavioral healthcare provider, and the goods and services for recovery-related goals; and
- (d) The eligibility requirements and responsibilities of the administrative entity, including all services to be provided by the entity, the responsibilities of staff employed or under contract with the entity for the pilot project, financial management and recordkeeping requirements, and documentations requirements relating to client participation in the project.
- (3) The <u>projects</u> project shall be evaluated by an independent entity whose evaluation must include an assessment of:
- (a) The criteria for selecting adult mental health clients who are with serious mental illness eligible for participation in the projects project.

(c) The accessibility and quality of services provided

- (c) The accessibility and quality of services provided under the projects by available community-based providers selected by the client, compared to those services that are available without the projects project.
- (d) The input by the clients in the development of treatment plans compared to other clients not participating in the <u>projects</u> project.
- (e) The achievement of individual treatment goals or outcome measures established for each client participating in the projects project compared to other mental health clients.
- (f) Any demonstrated improvements <u>and</u> or cost savings in the delivery of community-based mental health treatment and support services, including an explanation of the analyses used in determining cost savings.
- (g) All monitoring and oversight conducted by the Department of Children and Family Services or the Agency for Health Care Administration.
- (h) Any existing or appointed local advisory group assisting in the design and implementation of the $\underline{\text{projects}}$ $\underline{\text{project}}$.
- (i) The implementation status of the project in each district and identification of any problems with implementation.
- (j) Any adverse outcomes resulting from the projects, including conflicts of interest.
- A report of the independent evaluation of these projects which addresses the findings and recommendations of the evaluation

shall be provided to the appropriate legislative substantive committees and the department. A preliminary report is due by December 31, 2005, and the final report is due by December 31, 2006, including the elements specified in this subsection and recommendations concerning whether and how to expand the client-directed and choice-based pilot project for adults and the client-directed and choice-based pilot project for children.

- (4) The department shall work with the agency and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Education to determine the feasibility and cost effectiveness of obtaining federal waivers to support the expansion of the client-directed and choice-based pilot projects.

 Recommendations relating to the use of waiver funding which address any requirements relating to eligibility for funding and the management of the funding must be included in the report to the Legislature.
- Legislature reflecting the progress of the client-directed and choice-based project for adults and the client-directed and choice-based pilot project for children. At a minimum, the reports must include how project funds are allocated and managed for each district, project staffing, the number of participants in the project, the number of participants who leave the project and why they leave, the percentage of service plan and recovery plan goals that are met by program participants, and how recommendations from the annual independent evaluation are incorporated into practice. The first report is due to the appropriate legislative committees by January 31, 2005, and a final report is due by January 31, 2006.
