27	outcome and financial data that will allow consumers to
28	compare health care services. The performance outcomes and
29	financial data the agency must make available shall include,
30	but is not limited to, pharmaceuticals, physicians, health
31	care facilities, and health plans and managed care entities.

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- The agency shall submit the initial plan to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by March 1, 2005, and shall update the plan 3 and report on the status of its implementation annually thereafter. The agency shall also make the plan and status report available to the public on its Internet website. As 6 part of the plan, the agency shall identify the process and timeframes for implementation, any barriers to implementation, 8 and recommendations of changes in the law that may be enacted 9 by the Legislature to eliminate the barriers. As preliminary 10 11 elements of the plan, the agency shall: 1. Make available performance outcome and patient 12 charge data collected from health care facilities pursuant to 13 s. 408.061(1)(a) and (2). The agency shall determine which 14 15 conditions and procedures, performance outcomes, and patient 16 charge data to disclose based upon input from the council. When determining which conditions and procedures are to be 17 disclosed, the council and the agency shall consider variation 18 19 in costs, variation in outcomes, and magnitude of variations and other relevant information. When determining which 21 performance outcomes to disclose, the agency: a. Shall consider such factors as volume of cases; 22 23 average patient charges; average length of stay; complication rates; mortality rates; and infection rates, among others, 24 25 which shall be adjusted for case mix and severity, if 26 applicable. 27 b. May consider such additional measures that are
- adopted by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Studies, National Quality Forum, the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations, the Agency for Healthcare 31 Research and Quality, or a similar national entity that

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establishes standards to measure the performance of health care providers, or by other states.

- When determining which patient charge data to disclose, the 4 agency shall consider such measures as average charge, average net revenue per adjusted patient day, average cost per 6 adjusted patient day, and average cost per admission, among
- 2. Make available performance measures, benefit 9 design, and premium cost data from health plans licensed 10 pursuant to chapter 627 or chapter 641. The agency shall 11 12 determine which performance outcome and member and subscriber 13 cost data to disclose, based upon input from the council. When determining which data to disclose, the agency shall consider 14 15 information that may be required by either individual or group 16 purchasers to assess the value of the product, which may 17 include membership satisfaction, quality of care, current enrollment or membership, coverage areas, accreditation 18 19 status, premium costs, plan costs, premium increases, range of benefits, copayments and deductibles, accuracy and speed of claims payment, credentials of physicians, number of 21 2.2 providers, names of network providers, and hospitals in the 23 network. Health plans shall make available to the agency any such data or information that is not currently reported to the 24 25 agency or the office.
- 3. Determine the method and format for public disclosure of data reported pursuant to this paragraph. The agency shall make its determination based upon input from the Comprehensive Health Information System Advisory Council. At a minimum, the data shall be made available on the agency's 31 | Internet website in a manner that allows consumers to conduct

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1	an interactive search that allows them to view and compare the
2	information for specific providers. The website must include
3	such additional information as is determined necessary to
4	ensure that the website enhances informed decision making
5	among consumers and health care purchasers, which shall
6	include, at a minimum, appropriate quidance on how to use the
7	data and an explanation of why the data may vary from provider
8	to provider. The data specified in subparagraph 1. shall be
9	released no later than March 1, 2005. The data specified in
10	subparagraph 2. shall be released no later than March 1, 2006.
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
