10	commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as
11	provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.
12	(7) This section is subject to the Open Government
13	Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15, and
14	shall stand repealed on October 2, 2004, unless reviewed and
15	saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
16	Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2004.

20	Revises exemptions from the public records and public meetings law which are provided for certain records and
21	portions of meetings relating to the child fatalities investigated by the State Child Abuse Death Review
22	Committee, a local committee, or a panel assembled by the state or local committee. Deletes an exemption provided
23 for certain records obtained practitioner which relate to 24 those persons whose identiti	for certain records obtained by a hospital or health care practitioner which relate to child fatalities. Delineates
	those persons whose identities may be withheld from public disclosure under the act. Removes a provision that
25	provides for the repeal of the exemptions.
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
