An act relating to neighborhood crime watch programs; authorizing a county sheriff or municipal police department to establish neighborhood crime watch programs; providing for residents and business owners located within the county or municipality to participate in the program; prohibiting the harassment of a participant of a neighborhood crime watch program; providing criminal penalties; defining the term "harass"; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Establishment of neighborhood crime watch programs. -- A county sheriff or municipal police department may establish neighborhood crime watch programs within the county or municipality. The participants of a neighborhood crime watch program shall include, but need not be limited to, residents of

the county or municipality and owners of businesses located within the county or municipality.

- Section 2. <u>Harassment of participant of neighborhood crime</u> watch program prohibited; penalty; definition.--
- (1) It shall be a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, for any person to willfully harass a member of a neighborhood crime watch program for the purpose of intimidating or retaliating against the member for his or her participation in a neighborhood crime watch program. It shall be a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, for a person to harass a member of a neighborhood crime program while such member is traveling to or from a neighborhood crime watch meeting, actively participating in a neighborhood crime watch meeting or activity, or actively participating in an ongoing criminal investigation, as designated by a law enforcement officer.
- (2) As used in this section, the term "harass" means to engage in a course of conduct directed at a specific person which causes substantial emotional distress in that person and serves no legitimate purpose.
  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
