An act relating to neighborhood crime watch programs; authorizing a county sheriff or municipal police department to establish neighborhood crime watch programs; providing for residents and business owners located within the county or municipality to participate in the program; prohibiting the harassment of a participant of a neighborhood crime watch program; providing criminal penalties; providing definitions; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Establishment of neighborhood crime watch programs. -- A county sheriff or municipal police department may establish neighborhood crime watch programs within the county or municipality. The participants of a neighborhood crime watch program shall include, but need not be limited to, residents of the county or municipality and owners of businesses located within the county or municipality.

Section 2. <u>Harassment of participant of neighborhood crime</u> watch program prohibited; penalty; definition.--

(1) It shall be a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, for any person to willfully harass, threaten, or intimidate an identifiable member of a neighborhood crime watch program while such member is engaged in, or traveling to or from, an organized neighborhood crime watch program activity or a member who is

- (a) "Harass" means to engage in a course of conduct directed at a specific person which causes substantial emotional distress in that person and serves no legitimate purpose.
- (b) "Organized neighborhood crime watch program activity"

 means any prearranged event, meeting, or other scheduled

 activity, or neighborhood patrol, conducted by or at the

 direction of a neighborhood crime watch program or the program's

 authorized designee.
