### B. EFFECT OF PROPOSED CHANGES:

Registered nurses will no longer make monthly supervisory visits to patients of Nurse Registries who are receiving care or services from a certified nursing assistant or home health aide.

### Background

Florida law recognizes two licensed entities that may render home health care: home health agencies and nurse registries. Nurse registries were first defined and regulated by the state in 1947 under the "Private Employment Agency Regulatory Law" and were subject to the oversight of the Florida Industrial Commission. The statutes governing nurse registries were revised in 1957, 1974, 1990, and 1993. The 1993 law assigned regulatory responsibility to the Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA). The changes that year also provided that nurse registries could refer CNAs and required monthly visits by a registered nurse. The function of a nurse registry is to refer independent contractors, who are not "employees" of the registry, to individuals seeking home care services.

## C. SECTION DIRECTORY:

Section 1. This section amends section 400.506, F.S., related to the licensure and requirements that govern nurse registries, to remove the statutory requirement that registered nurses visit patients' homes monthly to assess the patient's condition and the quality of care being rendered by the certified nursing assistant or home health aide.

**Section 2.** This act shall take effect upon becoming law.
