## A bill to be entitled

An act relating to Escambia County; providing for the relief of Patricia Stolfi; authorizing and directing the Escambia County Utilities Authority to compensate Ms. Stolfi for personal injuries that she suffered due to the negligence of an employee of the utilities authority; providing for attorney's fees and costs; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, at approximately 11:45 p.m. on October 9, 1997, Patricia Stolfi, driving a 1996 Geo, was returning to her home from work, traveling west on Bellview Road, a two-lane road, in Escambia County, and

WHEREAS, an employee of the Escambia County Utilities

Authority was collecting garbage on an unnamed, two-lane, paved

road that intersected Bellview Road, and

WHEREAS, the driver of the garbage truck, in order to exit the unnamed road, backed out into Bellview Road, and

WHEREAS, as a result of backing out, the garbage truck blocked both lanes of Bellview Road, and

WHEREAS, all safety lights on the garbage truck were positioned on the truck at an angle, preventing Ms. Stolfi from seeing the safety lights, and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stolfi did not see the garbage truck in the darkness until she was approximately 64 feet from the truck, and

WHEREAS, despite her efforts to stop, Ms. Stolfi was unable to stop her vehicle and collided with the garbage truck as it blocked Bellview Road, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the accident, Ms. Stolfi suffered severe injuries, including a mid-shaft femur fracture, a right

radius ulna fracture, and a near amputation of her right hand, and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stolfi required a long course of medical treatment and surgery, including insertion of a intra-medullary rod into her right leg; skin graphs; various surgical procedures to her right hand; and closed manipulation of the right shoulder, elbow, and wrist, and

WHEREAS, those injuries necessitated extensive medical treatment, rehabilitation, and restorative treatments, and Ms. Stolfi expects further medical procedures in the future, and

WHEREAS, as a result of the injuries to her hand, Ms. Stolfi can no longer perform her current occupation as a seamstress nor that of a medical transcriptionist for which she had almost completed her training, and

WHEREAS, after litigation relating to this accident was commenced in Escambia County, a jury, on August 30, 2001, rendered a verdict against the Escambia County Utilities Authority and for Ms. Stolfi in the amount of \$2,747,000, and

WHEREAS, the jury, after considering comparative negligence, apportioned 95 percent of the fault to the Escambia County Utilities Authority and 5 percent to Ms. Stolfi, resulting in a final judgment of \$2,480,889 entered against the utility authority, and

WHEREAS, the Escambia County Utilities Authority appealed the final judgment to the First District Court of Appeals, which final judgment was affirmed, per curiam, by that court on April 11, 2003, and

WHEREAS, the Escambia County Utilities Authority has tendered to Ms. Stolfi the sum of \$100,000, which is the statutory limit on waivers of sovereign immunity, and

WHEREAS, at the time of the accident, the Escambia County
Utilities Authority was insured for general liability by Coregis
Insurance Company for \$1.1 million, but the company has not
offered Ms. Stolfi the policy limits, and

WHEREAS, Ms. Stolfi is, therefore, petitioning the Legislature for further reimbursement in the amount of \$2,380,889, NOW, THEREFORE,
