I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Executive Branch Lobby Registration Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Executive Branch Lobby Registration Trust Fund, FLAIR #11-2-203, is administered by the legislative branch. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-79, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 112.3215, F.S., creates and provides a revenue source for the Executive Branch Lobby Registration Trust Fund. The fund is used for the purpose of funding any office established to administer the registration of lobbyists lobbying an agency, including the payment of salaries and other expenses. The source of revenues for the trust fund are annual registration fees. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-03 were \$74,266.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
