I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Relocation and Construction Trust Fund without modification. The Relocation and Construction Trust Fund, FLAIR #42-2-584, is administered by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-55, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Pursuant to s. 253.025(13), F.S., with the consent of the majority of the Governor and Cabinet, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services has the authority to sell, convey, transfer, exchange, trade or purchase land on which a forestry facility resides for money or other more suitable property on which to relocate the facility. Funds from the types of transactions listed are deposited in the Department's Relocation and Construction Trust Fund. According to LAS/PBS data, receipts to this fund for FY 2002-2003 were \$2 million.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
