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WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that caring and qualified public school teachers play a critical role in preparing children and young adults for success in higher education and in the workplace, and

15 WHEREAS, the Legislature further recognizes that Florida's 16 average teacher salary is significantly below the national 17 average and that the State of Florida will need an estimated 18 162,296 teachers over the next ten years to address the high 19 turnover of new and retiring teachers plus additional teachers

to comply with the amendment to s. 1, Art. IX of the State Constitution, relating to class size reduction, and

WHEREAS, it is therefore the intent of the Legislature to provide funding for competitive salaries to help school districts retain and recruit caring and qualified teachers in the public schools, NOW, THEREFORE,

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 1012.715, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

1012.715 Teacher Salary Improvement Program. --

- (1) The Teacher Salary Improvement Program is created to provide funding for improved salaries for instructional personnel, as defined in s. 1012.01, in the K-12 public school system. For purposes of this section, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind shall be considered a school district.
- (2) The Department of Education shall distribute to each school district an amount as prescribed annually by the Legislature for the Teacher Salary Improvement Program, unless otherwise provided in the General Appropriations Act.
- (a) Each member of instructional personnel who received a satisfactory performance review pursuant to s. 1012.34 during the previous school year, and with whom the school district has entered into a professional services contract during the current school year, shall be eligible to receive a salary increase pursuant to this section.
- (b) A school district may establish additional criteria in order to award funds allocated to the school district for purposes of this section.
- (3) The Department of Education shall provide technical assistance to any school district that requests guidance regarding the implementation of this section.
- (4) The State Board of Education may adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to implement the provisions of this section.
- Section 2. There is hereby appropriated for fiscal year 2004-2005 from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of
