This legislation re-creates the Working Capital Trust Fund without modification. The Working Capital Trust Fund, FLAIR #43-2-792, is administered by the Department of Financial Services. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 99-76, Laws of Florida.
