I. Summary:

This bill re-creates the Child Welfare Training Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Child Welfare Training Trust Fund, FLAIR #60-2-083, is administered by the Department of Children and Family Services. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-6, Laws of Florida.

This bill re-creates section 402.40, Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

The fund is used to fund a comprehensive system of child welfare training, including the securing of consultants to develop the system, the staff of the council, the expenses of the council members, the child welfare training academies and the participation of dependency program staff in the training.
