This bill re-creates the Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund, FLAIR #64-2-192, is administered by the Department of Health. This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-43, Laws of Florida.

This bill re-creates section 401.345, Florida Statutes.
