Section 458.348, Florida Statutes, is amended 20 21 to read: 22 458.348 Formal supervisory relationships, standing orders, 23 and established protocols; notice; standards; supervisory relationships with advanced registered nurse practitioners or 24 25 physician assistants practicing outside the physician office 26 practice setting. --27 (1) NOTICE.--

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28 When a physician enters into a formal supervisory (a) 29 relationship or standing orders with an emergency medical 30 technician or paramedic licensed pursuant to s. 401.27, which relationship or orders contemplate the performance of medical 31 acts, or when a physician enters into an established protocol 32 with an advanced registered nurse practitioner, which protocol 33 34 contemplates the performance of medical acts identified and 35 approved by the joint committee pursuant to s. 464.003(3)(c) or acts set forth in s. 464.012(3) and (4), the physician shall 36 37 submit notice to the board. The notice shall contain a statement in substantially the following form: 38

(b) Notice shall be filed within 30 days <u>after</u> of entering
into the relationship, orders, or protocol. Notice also shall be

50 (2) ESTABLISHMENT OF STANDARDS BY JOINT COMMITTEE.--The
51 joint committee created by s. 464.003(3)(c) shall determine
52 minimum standards for the content of established protocols
53 pursuant to which an advanced registered nurse practitioner may
54 perform medical acts identified and approved by the joint
55 committee pursuant to s. 464.003(3)(c) or acts set forth in s.

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464.012(3) and (4) and shall determine minimum standards for 56 57 supervision of such acts by the physician, unless the joint 58 committee determines that any act set forth in s. 464.012(3) or 59 (4) is not a medical act. Such standards shall be based on risk 60 to the patient and acceptable standards of medical care and 61 shall take into account the special problems of medically 62 underserved areas. The standards developed by the joint 63 committee shall be adopted as rules by the Board of Nursing and 64 the Board of Medicine for purposes of carrying out their 65 responsibilities pursuant to part I of chapter 464 and this chapter, respectively, but neither board shall have disciplinary 66 powers over the licensees of the other board. 67

75 (4) SUPERVISORY RELATIONSHIPS WITH ADVANCED REGISTERED 76 NURSE PRACTITIONERS OR PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS PRACTICING OUTSIDE 77 THE PHYSICIAN OFFICE PRACTICE SETTING.--

(a) For purposes of this subsection, the term "physician office practice setting" means a business location where a physician delivers medical services regardless of whether the business is physician owned or nonphysician owned. A physician office practice setting includes a location where medical services are performed other than at a hospital, an ambulatory

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84 surgical center, an abortion clinic, or any other medical 85 facility licensed by the Department of Health, the Agency for Health Care Administration, or a successor agency. A business 86 87 location is a physician office practice setting if a physician 88 is physically present in the business location during the 89 provision of care greater than 33 percent of the hours of 90 operation in which medical care is provided. A business location that does not meet this requirement shall be considered outside 91 a physician office practice setting during all hours when a 92 physician is not physically present, irrespective of the 93 94 ownership or business name of the site. 95 (b) A physician who is in a supervisory relationship with 96 an advanced registered nurse practitioner as described in s. 97 464.012(4)(c) or a physician assistant as described in s. 98 458.347(2)(f) who is practicing outside a physician office 99 practice setting of the supervising physician shall: 100 1. Maintain a valid and unrestricted active Florida 101 license pursuant to this chapter and a valid federal controlled 102 substance registry number pursuant to chapter 893. 103 2. Provide indirect supervision as defined by the Board of Medicine to the advanced registered nurse practitioner or 104 105 physician assistant. 106 3. Notwithstanding the number of supervisory relationships 107 authorized in s. 458.347(3), maintain no more than two 108 supervisory relationships with any combination of advanced 109 registered nurse practitioners or physician assistants outside 110 the physician office practice setting at any one time.

Delegate only tasks and procedures to the advanced registered nurse practitioner or physician assistant which are 112 113 within the supervising physician's practice and medical 114 specialty area. 115 5. Ensure that the advanced registered nurse practitioner 116 or physician assistant has been actively practicing within the 117 medical specialty area for a minimum of 4 consecutive years prior to providing care in a practice setting outside the 118 119 physician office practice setting of the supervising physician. 120 6. Ensure that the advanced registered nurse practitioner 121 or physician assistant under supervision clearly identifies to 122 the patient that he or she is an advanced registered nurse 123 practitioner or a physician assistant.
