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468.707 Licensure by examination; requirements.--

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80 The board may, by rule, prescribe continuing education (2) 81 requirements, not to exceed 24 hours biennially. The criteria 82 for continuing education shall be approved by the board and 83 shall include a current certificate in 4 hours in standard first aid and cardiovascular pulmonary resuscitation from the American 84 85 Red Cross or equivalent training as determined by the board. (3) (4) A person from administering standard first aid 105 106 treatment to an athlete.

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107 (4) (4) (5) A person licensed under chapter 548, provided such person is acting within the scope of such license. 108

109 (5) (6) A person providing personal training instruction 110 for exercise, aerobics, or weightlifting, if the person does not 111 represent himself or herself as able to provide "athletic 112 trainer" services and if any recognition or treatment of injuries is limited to the provision of first aid. 113

Section 1012.46, Florida Statutes, is amended 114 Section 5. 115 to read:

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1012.46 Athletic trainers.--

117 School districts may establish and implement an (1)118 athletic injuries prevention and treatment program. Central to 119 this program should be the employment and availability of 120 persons trained in the prevention and treatment of physical 121 injuries that which may occur during athletic activities. The 122 program should reflect opportunities for progressive advancement 123 and compensation in employment as provided in subsection (2) and meet certain other minimum standards developed by the Department 124 125 of Education. The goal of the Legislature is to have school districts employ and have available a full-time teacher athletic 126 trainer in each high school in the state. 127

128 (2) To the extent practicable, a school district program should include the following employment classification and 129 advancement scheme: 130

131 (a) First responder.--To qualify as a first responder, a 132 person must possess a professional, temporary, part-time, 133 adjunct, or substitute certificate pursuant to s. 1012.56, be 134 certified in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, first aid, and have Page 5 of 6

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135 15 semester hours in courses such as care and prevention of athletic injuries, anatomy, physiology, nutrition, counseling, 136 137 and other similar courses approved by the Commissioner of 138 Education. This person may only administer first aid and similar 139 care. (2)(b) Teacher athletic trainer.-- To qualify as an a 140 141 teacher athletic trainer, a person must be licensed under part 142 XIII of chapter 468 and may possess a professional, temporary, part-time, adjunct, or substitute certificate pursuant to s. 143 144 1012.35, s. 1012.56 or s. 1012.57, and be licensed as required 145 by part XIII of chapter 468.

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Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
