10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

12	Section 1. Section 413.407, Florida Statutes, is amended
13	to read:
14	413.407 Assistive Technology Advisory CouncilThere is
15	created the Assistive Technology Advisory Council, responsible
16	for ensuring consumer involvement in the creation, application,
17	and distribution of technology-related assistance to and for
18	persons who have disabilities. The council shall fulfill its
19	responsibilities through statewide policy development, both
20	state and federal legislative initiatives, advocacy at both the
21	state and federal level, planning of statewide resource
22	allocations, policy-level management, reviews of both consumer
23	responsiveness and the adequacy of program service delivery, and
24	by performing the functions listed in this section.
25	(1)(a) The council shall be composed of:
26	1. <u>Individuals</u> Nine persons who have disabilities and who
27	are assistive technology consumers or <u>family members or</u>
28	guardians of those individuals.
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29	2. Representatives of consumer organizations concerned
30	with assistive technology.
31	<u>3.</u> 2. Up to nine Representatives of business and industry,
32	including the insurance industry, concerned with assistive
33	technology.
34	3. Up to nine representatives of academia, community
35	agencies, and state agencies concerned with assistive
36	technology.
37	4. A representative of the Division of Vocational
38	Rehabilitation.
39	5. A representative of the Division of Blind Services.
40	6. A representative of the Independent Living Council.
41	7. A representative of Workforce Florida, Inc.
42	8. A representative of the Department of Education.
43	9. Representatives of other state agencies that provide or
44	coordinate services for persons with disabilities.
45	
46	Total membership on the council shall not exceed 27 at any one
47	time. A majority of the members shall be appointed in accordance
48	with subparagraph 1.
49	(b) Members of the council shall be appointed by the
50	Commissioner of Education secretary from a list of candidates
51	proposed by the division director.
52	(c) A majority of council members shall be persons who
53	have disabilities as <u>defined</u> described in <u>s. 413.20(7)</u> s.
54	706(8)(B) of the act who are also consumers of assistive
55	technology or family members of such persons.

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(d) The members of the council shall select two co-chairsfrom among the membership of the council.

One co-chair may be selected from the group described
 in paragraph (c) and one co-chair shall be selected from the
 other council members.

61 2. No co-chair may be an elected member or an employee of62 a state agency or of any political subdivision of the state.

(e)1. Each member of the council shall serve for a term ofnot more than 3 years, except that:

a. a member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring prior to
the expiration of the term for which a predecessor was appointed
shall be appointed for the remainder of such term.

b. The terms of service of the members shall be staggered
through initial appointments of 3 years for one-third, 2 years
for one third, and 1 year for one third. Each eligible group
described in paragraph (a) shall reflect this distribution.

No member of the council may serve more than two
consecutive terms; however, any appointment under <u>subparagraph</u>
<u>1. sub-subparagraph 1.a.</u>, if for less than 18 months, shall not
be considered a term for the purposes of this section.

3. A member who has served two consecutive terms and has
been retired from the council for at least 1 year may be
reappointed to the council on the same basis as a new member.

(f) Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment. A vacancy does not affect the power of the remaining members to execute the duties of the council.

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83 (2) In addition to the other functions specified in this84 section, the council shall:

(a) Act as the board of directors of a not-for-profit
corporation created by the division. Through the corporation,
the council shall provide direction and funding to Florida's
Alliance for Assistive Services and Technology, a project
sponsored by the department for the coordination and delivery of
appropriate, cost-effective, state-of-the-art assistive
technology services and devices.

92 (b) Appoint committees made up of members of the council 93 to focus on specific issues within the council's mandate. 94 Committees may request and accept in-kind contributions of 95 personnel from public or private entities to supply such 96 staffing as the committees deem necessary to carry out their 97 individual mandates. (c) Review and approve all reports, recommendations, andproposed actions of committee staff.

(d) Appoint the executive director of the alliance. The
executive director shall be responsible for overall
administration and day-to-day direction of the alliance, as well
as supervision of all staff.

(e) Annually review and approve the strategic or businessplan of the alliance, as submitted by the executive director.

(f) Submit an annual comprehensive report of the activities of the council, the corporation, and the alliance to the division director.

(g) Perform such other functions as the council determines
to be appropriate which are comparable to functions performed by
the council.

(h) Convene at least four meetings each year in such
places as it determines to be necessary to conduct council
business and may conduct such forums or hearings as the council
considers appropriate. The council shall make a report of each
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meeting which shall include a record of its discussions and 139 recommendations, all of which reports shall be made available to 140 141 the public. (3) In accordance with Pub. L. No. 108-364, the council 142 143 shall: Investigate financing options that will increase 144 (a) access to and funding for assistive technology devices and 145 146 assistive technology services. 147 (b) Develop assistive technology demonstrations, 148 reutilization programs, and loan programs. 149 (c) Provide training and technical assistance in order to 150 increase knowledge and awareness of the uses and benefits of 151 assistive technology devices and assistive technology services. 152 (d) Promote public awareness activities designed to provide information relating to the benefits of assistive 153 154 technology devices and assistive technology services. 155 (e) Promote coordination and collaboration among public 156 and private entities that are responsible for policies, 157 procedures, or funding for the provision of assistive technology 158 devices and assistive technology services. 159 Section 2.
