A complaint, all information obtained by the 3 4 commission during the resultant investigation, and the minutes 5 and findings of a probable cause panel shall be confidential б and exempt from the provisions of s. 24(a), Art. I of the 7 State Constitution and s. 119.07(1) for a maximum of 10 days after the panel declares findings of probable cause. All 8 proceedings of a probable cause panel are exempt from the 9 10 provisions of s. 24(b), Art. I of the State Constitution and 286.011 for a maximum of 10 days after the probable cause 11 12 panel declares the findings. 13 2. This paragraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act of 1995 in accordance with s. 119.15 and 14 shall stand repealed on October 2, 2010, unless reviewed and 15 saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 16 17 Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public 18 necessity that a complaint, information obtained during the resultant investigation, and the minutes and findings of a 19 20 probable cause panel relating to suspected violations of 21 chapter 1005, Florida Statutes, or rules of the Commission for 22 Independent Education be held confidential and exempt from 23 public disclosure for a maximum of 10 days after a panel declares findings of probable cause. In addition, the 2.4 Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that the 25 proceedings of a probable cause panel relating to such 26 27 violations be exempt from public meetings requirements for a 2.8 maximum of 10 days after the panel declares findings of probable cause. The Legislature finds that lack of 29 confidentiality during an institutional investigation and the 30 probable cause process impedes the investigation. The 31

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Legislature finds that false accusations against an institution, or the dissemination of inaccurate information, may result in harm to past graduates and current students by improperly tainting the reputation of an institution and the credentials of its students. By ensuring confidentiality during the investigatory and probable cause processes, the state helps to maintain and enforce the federal Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act by ensuring that student records are kept confidential. Section 3. This act shall take effect on the same date that SB _____ or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law.

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
