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I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Lifetime Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2008. The Lifetime Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund, FLAIR # 77-2-458, is administered by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. This fund was last re-created effective by Chapter 2001-27, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

The Lifetime Fish and Wildlife Trust Fund is used for the purpose of supporting fish and wildlife conservation programs of the state. Section 372.105, F.S., provides sources of revenue for the fund, which are public contributions and the interest income and accruing from the investments of proceeds from the sale of lifetime fishing and hunting licenses.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
