Section 380.276, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 18 19 380.276 Beaches and coastal areas; display of uniform 20 warning and safety flags at on public beaches; placement of 21 uniform notification signs; beach safety education .--22 It is the intent of the Legislature that a cooperative (1)23 effort among state agencies and local governments be undertaken Page 1 of 4

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24 to plan for and assist in the display of uniform warning and 25 safety flags, and the placement of uniform notification signs that provide the meaning of such warning and safety flags, at on 26 27 the public beaches along the coast of the state. Because the varying natural conditions of Florida's public beaches and 28 29 coastal areas pose significant risks to the safety of tourists and the general public, it is important to inform the public of 30 the need to exercise caution. 31

The Department of Environmental Protection, through 32 (2) 33 the Florida Coastal Management Program, shall direct and 34 coordinate the uniform warning and safety flag program. The 35 purpose of the program shall be to encourage the display of uniform warning and safety flags at all public beaches along the 36 37 coast of the state at which warning and safety flags are 38 displayed and lifeguards are on duty, and to encourage the 39 placement of uniform notification signs that provide the meaning 40 of such flags. Only warning and safety flags developed by the department shall be displayed. Participation in the program 41 42 shall be open to any government having jurisdiction over a 43 public beach along the coast, whether or not the beach has 44 lifeguards.

(3) The Department of Environmental Protection shall develop a program for the display of uniform warning and safety flags at all public beaches along the coast of the state at which warning and safety flags are displayed and lifeguards are on duty, and for the placement of uniform notification signs that provide the meaning of the flags displayed. Such a program shall provide:

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52 (a) For posted notification of the meaning of each of the53 warning and safety flags at all designated public access points.

54 (b) That uniform notification signs be posted in a55 conspicuous location and be clearly legible.

(c) A standard size, shape, color, and definition for eachwarning and safety flag.

58 (d) That flags incorporate a numerical designation to
 59 accommodate persons who are colorblind.

60 (e) That flags not specifically defined by the department
61 must be identified by the entity displaying the flags in the
62 posted notification.

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(f) Guidelines for the periodic replacement of flags.

64 The Department of Environmental Protection is (4) 65 authorized, within the limits of appropriations or grants available to it for such purposes, to establish and operate a 66 67 program to encourage the display of uniform warning and safety 68 flags at on all public beaches along the coast of the state and to encourage the placement of uniform notification signs that 69 70 provide the meaning of the flags displayed. The department shall 71 coordinate the implementation of the uniform warning and safety flag program with local governing bodies and the Florida Beach 72 73 Patrol Chiefs Association.

74 (5) The Department of Environmental Protection may adopt
75 rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 necessary to
76 administer this section.

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80 entities or authorities, and their individual employees and agents, shall governments, and local government agencies may not 81 be held liable for any injury or loss of life caused by changing 82 83 surf and other naturally occurring conditions along coastal 84 areas, whether or not uniform warning and safety flags or 85 notification signs developed by the department are displayed or posted the reasonable placement or location of uniform warning 86 87 and safety flags or reasonably posted uniform notification signs or the failure to install uniform warning and safety flags or 88 89 posted uniform notification signs as provided by this section. 90 (7) The Department of Environmental Protection, through 91 the Florida Coastal Management Program, may also develop and 92 make available to the public other educational information and 93 materials related to beach safety.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.

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
