24	(2) Interscholastic Extracurricular student activities						
25	are an important complement to the academic curriculum.						
26	Participation in a comprehensive extracurricular and academic						
27	program contributes to student development of the social and						
28	intellectual skills necessary to become a well-rounded adult.						
29	As used in this section, the term "extracurricular" means any						
30	school-authorized or education-related activity, including,						
31	but not limited to, interscholastic activities, occurring						
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1	during or outside the regular instructional school day. For					
2	purposes of this section, a student shall not be precluded					
3	from receiving tutoring, performing community service, or					
4	attending school athletic, social, and academic functions.					
5	However, a student who is not eligible, pursuant to this					
6	section, to participate in extracurricular activities shall					
7	not perform at school functions or travel with a school team,					
8	band, club, or other organization to any event where the group					
9	is to compete or perform. This section does not prohibit a					
10	student who is enrolled in a class designated by the student					
11	course code directory provided by the Department of Education					
12	from performing or traveling to compete or perform as part of					
13	the class curriculum.					
14	(3)(a) To be eligible to participate in					
15	interscholastic extracurricular student activities, a student					
16	must:					
17	1. Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a					
18	4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the previous semester or a					
19	cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale,					
20	or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1).					
21	2. Execute and fulfill the requirements of an academic					
22	performance contract between the student, the district school					
23	board, the appropriate governing association, and the					
24	student's parents, if the student's cumulative grade point					
25	average falls below 2.0, or its equivalent, on a 4.0 scale in					
26	the courses required by s. 1003.43(1) or, for students who					
27	entered the 9th grade prior to the 1997-1998 school year, if					
28	the student's cumulative grade point average falls below 2.0					
29	on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by					
30	s. 1003.43(1) that are taken after July 1, 1997. At a minimum,					
31	the contract must require that the student attend summer 2					
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1 school, or its graded equivalent, between grades 9 and 10 or grades 10 and 11, as necessary. 2 3. Have a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or 3 4 above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. 1003.43(1) during his or her junior or senior 5 6 year. 7 4. Maintain satisfactory conduct and, if a student is convicted of, or is found to have committed, a felony or a 8 delinquent act which would have been a felony if committed by 9 10 an adult, regardless of whether adjudication is withheld, the 11 student's participation in interscholastic extracurricular activities is contingent upon established and published 12 13 district school board policy. 14 15 District school boards are encouraged to establish a process 16 to waive the requirements of this paragraph based on extenuating circumstances of an individual student. The State 17 Board of Education shall approve each school district's waiver 18 19 process prior to implementation. 20 (b) Any student who is exempt from attending a full school day based on rules adopted by the district school board 21 22 for double session schools or programs, experimental schools, or schools operating under emergency conditions must maintain 23 2.4 the grade point average required by this section and pass each class for which he or she is enrolled. The establishment and 25 approval of the waiver process pursuant to paragraph (a) shall 26 apply to the requirements of this paragraph. 27 (c) An individual home education student is eligible 28 29 to participate at the public school to which the student would be assigned according to district school board attendance area 30 31 policies or which the student could choose to attend pursuant 1:16 PM 04/13/05 h014902e1d-20-2c3

26	her intent to participate in interscholastic extracurricular					
27	activities as a representative of the school before the					
28	beginning date of the season for the activity in which he or					
29	she wishes to participate. A home education student must be					
30	able to participate in curricular activities if that is a					
31	requirement for an extracurricular activity.					
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1 6. A student who transfers from a home education program to a public school before or during the first grading 2 period of the school year is academically eligible to 3 4 participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities during the first grading period provided the student has a 5 successful evaluation from the previous school year, pursuant 6 7 to subparagraph 2. 7. Any public school or private school student who has 8 been unable to maintain academic eligibility for participation 9 in interscholastic extracurricular activities is ineligible to 10 11 participate in such activities as a home education student until the student has successfully completed one grading 12 13 period in home education pursuant to subparagraph 2. to become eligible to participate as a home education student. 14 (d) An individual charter school student pursuant to 15 s. 1002.33 is eligible to participate at the public school to 16 which the student would be assigned according to district 17 school board attendance area policies or which the student 18 could choose to attend, pursuant to district or interdistrict 19 20 controlled open-enrollment provisions, in any interscholastic extracurricular activity of that school, unless such activity 21 22 is provided by the student's charter school, if the following conditions are met: 23 24 1. The charter school student must meet the requirements of the charter school education program as 25 determined by the charter school governing board. 26 2. During the period of participation at a school, the 27 charter school student must demonstrate educational progress 28 29 as required in paragraph (b). 3. 4. The charter school student must meet the same 2 standards of acceptance, behavior, and performance that are 3 4 required of other students in extracurricular activities. 5. The charter school student must register with the 5 school his or her intent to participate in interscholastic 6 7 extracurricular activities as a representative of the school before the beginning date of the season for the activity in 8 which he or she wishes to participate. A charter school 9 10 student must be able to participate in curricular activities 11 if that is a requirement for an extracurricular activity. 6. A student who transfers from a charter school 12 13 program to a traditional public school before or during the first grading period of the school year is academically 14 15 eligible to participate in interscholastic extracurricular activities during the first grading period if the student has 16 a successful evaluation from the previous school year, 17 pursuant to subparagraph 2. 18 7. Any public school or private school student who has 19 20 been unable to maintain academic eligibility for participation 21 in interscholastic extracurricular activities is ineligible to 22 participate in such activities as a charter school student until the student has successfully completed one grading 23 24 period in a charter school pursuant to subparagraph 2. to become eligible to participate as a charter school student. 25 (4) The student standards for participation in 26 interscholastic extracurricular activities must be applied 27 beginning with the student's first semester of the 9th grade. 28 29 Each student must meet such other requirements for participation as may be established by the district school 30 31 board; however, a district school board may not establish 1:16 PM 04/13/05 h014902e1d-20-2c3
