Paragraph (a) of subsection (22) of section 13 121.021, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 14 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 15 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 16 17 (22) "Compensation" means the monthly salary paid a 18 member by his or her employer for work performed arising from that employment. 19 20 (a) Compensation shall include: 1. Overtime payments paid from a salary fund. 21 22 2. Accumulated annual leave payments. 23 3. Payments in addition to the employee's base rate of pay if all the following apply: 24 The payments are paid according to a formal written 25 a. 26 policy that applies to all eligible employees equally; 27 b. The policy provides that payments shall commence no 2.8 later than the 11th year of employment; 29 c. The payments are paid for as long as the employee continues his or her employment; and 30 d. The payments are paid at least annually. 31 1

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1	4. Amounts withheld for tax sheltered annuities or
2	deferred compensation programs, or any other type of salary
3	reduction plan authorized under the Internal Revenue Code.
4	5. Payments made in lieu of a permanent increase in
5	the base rate of pay, whether made annually or in 12 or 26
6	equal payments within a 12-month period, when the member's
7	base pay is at the maximum of his or her pay range. When a
8	portion of a member's annual increase raises his or her pay
9	range and the excess is paid as a lump sum payment, such lump
10	sum payment shall be compensation for retirement purposes.
11	6. Effective July 1, 2002, salary supplements made
12	pursuant to s. 1012.72 requiring a valid National Board for
13	Professional Standards certificate, notwithstanding the
14	provisions of subparagraph 3.
15	7. Effective July 1, 2005, salary supplements made to
16	firefighters, paramedics, or emergency medical technicians for
17	the successful completion of employer-approved educational
18	training or for additional job-related duties and
19	responsibilities, notwithstanding the provisions of
20	subparagraph 3. For all periods prior to July 1, 2005,
21	employer-reported retirement contributions on these
22	supplemental payments shall be compensation.
23	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2005.
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
