- (c) A county or municipality may establish a volunteer 5 6 disaster assistance recovery program within the county or 7 municipality for the purpose of facilitating and improving communications between emergency managers and the public in 8 the event of an emergency or natural disaster, and for the 10 purpose of delivering supplies and services through 11 prearranged agreements with local businesses. Local governments may form disaster assistance recovery advisory 12 13 committees to negotiate voluntary compliance standards and agreements with local businesses for the provision of goods 14 15 and services in the period immediately preceding, during, and immediately after a declared emergency. The members of the 16 disaster assistance recovery advisory committee shall include, 17 18 but need not be limited to, residents of the county or municipality and owners of businesses that are located within 19 20 the county or municipality.
 - (d) Pursuant to s. 252.41, a county or municipality may require a representative of a private utility company be present at its local emergency operations center for purposes of coordination during an actual emergency or natural disaster if other adequate means of coordination cannot be readily established.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
