Accessibility, utilization, and 11 12 coordination of appropriate assistive technology devices and services are essential as a young person with disabilities 13 moves from preschool to school, from one school to another, 14 and from school to employment or independent living. To ensure 15 that an assistive technology device issued to a young person 16 17 as part of his or her individualized family support plan or 18 individual education plan remains with the individual through such transitions, interagency agreements shall be developed 19 and executed. The request that an assistive technology device 20 21 be retained for use by an individual as he or she moves 22 through the continuum from home to school to postschool must 23 be made to the owner by the individual or his or her parent or 2.4 quardian. Interagency agreements shall be entered into by the following: 25 (1) The Florida Infants and Toddlers Early 26 27 Intervention Program in the Division of Children's Medical 2.8 Services of the Department of Health. 29 (2) The Division of Blind Services, the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student Services, and the Division 30 of Vocational Rehabilitation of the Department of Education. 31
