A description of the processes and procedures that 10 11 will be used to identify and manage the project's risks and to manage changes in the requirements of the project. 12 13 Upon approval of the operational work plan, the agency is 14 15 authorized to request the release of funds and positions pursuant to chapter 216 and in a manner consistent with the 16 spending plan component of the operational work plan. Funds 17 or positions released for the information technology project 18 may not exceed the amount identified in the approved 19 operational work plan. Operational work plans shall be updated 20 as required in the General Appropriations Act. 21 22 (c) The agency shall submit to the chairs of the legislative appropriations committees, and to the Executive 23 24 Office of the Governor for executive branch agencies, or the Chief Justice for judicial entities branch, project status 25 reports comparing the planned progress of the project as 2.6 specified in the operational work plan versus the actual 27 progress made to date, the actual completion dates, and the 28 29 actual costs incurred.
