19	Section 1. Subsections (6) and (7) are added to section

22	(6) "Youth athletic organization" means a private not-for-
23	profit organization that promotes and provides organized
24	athletic activities to youth.
25	(7) "Automated external defibrillator device" means a

27	Section 2. Section 401.111, Florida Statutes, is amended
28	to read:
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29 Emergency medical services grant program; 401.111 authority. -- The department is hereby authorized to make grants 30 to local agencies, and emergency medical services organizations, 31 and youth athletic organizations in accordance with any 32 33 agreement entered into pursuant to this part. These grants shall be designed to assist local said agencies and emergency medical 34 services organizations in providing emergency medical services, 35 including emergency medical dispatch, and to assist youth 36 athletic organizations that work in conjunction with local 37 emergency medical services organizations to expand the use of 38 39 automated external defibrillator devices in the community. The 40 cost of administering this program shall be paid by the department from funds appropriated to it. 41 42 Section 3. Paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) of section 401.113, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 43 401.113 Department; powers and duties.--44 The department shall annually dispense funds contained 45 (2)in the Emergency Medical Services Trust Fund as follows: 46 Forty-five percent of such moneys must be divided 47 (a) among the counties according to the proportion of the combined 48 49 amount deposited in the trust fund from the county. These funds may not be used to match grant funds as identified in paragraph 50 (b). An individual board of county commissioners may distribute 51 these funds to emergency medical service organizations and youth 52 53 athletic organizations within the county, as it deems appropriate. 54 55 Forty percent of such moneys must be used by the (b) 56 department for making matching grants to local agencies,

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57 municipalities, and emergency medical services organizations, 58 <u>and youth athletic organizations</u> for the purpose of conducting 59 research, increasing existing levels of emergency medical 60 services, evaluation, community education, injury-prevention 61 programs, and training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and 62 other lifesaving and first aid techniques.

available on a cash matching basis. A grant made under this

No more than 10 percent of these moneys must be made 68 2. 69 available to rural emergency medical services, and 70 notwithstanding the restrictions specified in subsection (1), these moneys may be used for improvement, expansion, or 71 continuation of services provided. A grant made under this 72 subparagraph must be contingent upon the recipient providing a 73 cash sum equal to no more than 10 percent of the total 74 75 department-approved grant amount.
