The civil and criminal laws of Florida shall obtain on 27 (2) 28 all Indian reservations in this state and shall be enforced in 29 the same manner as elsewhere throughout the state. 30 Subsections (1) and (2) do not apply to Indian (3) reservations of the Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Florida. 31 32 Section 2. For the purpose of incorporating the amendment 33 to section 285.16, Florida Statutes, in a reference thereto, 34 subsection (3) of section 285.061, Florida Statutes, is 35 reenacted to read: 36 285,061 Transfer of land to United States in trust for Seminole and Miccosukee Indian Tribes.--37 All the provisions of this chapter, not in conflict 38 (3) with this section, remain in full force and effect. (c) To employ personnel to exercise law enforcement powers, including the investigation of violations of any of the criminal laws of the state occurring on reservations over which the state has assumed jurisdiction pursuant to s. 285.16.

59 1. All law enforcement personnel employed shall be 60 considered peace officers for all purposes and shall have the 61 authority to bear arms, make arrests, and apply for, serve, and 62 execute search warrants, arrest warrants, capias, and other 63 process of the court, and to enforce criminal and noncriminal 64 traffic offenses, within their respective special improvement 65 districts.

All law enforcement personnel shall be entitled to theprivileges, protection, and benefits of ss. 112.19 and 870.05.

Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
