26	1008.22 Student assessment program for public
27	schools
28	(1) PURPOSEThe primary purposes of the student
29	assessment program are to provide information needed to
30	improve the public schools by enhancing the learning gains of
31	all students and to inform parents of the educational progress
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of their public school children. The program must be designed to:

- (f) Provide information on the performance of Florida students compared with other students others across the United States.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Education use innovations in technology and assessment to allow the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) to be administered no earlier than March 15 in 2006, no earlier than April 1 in 2007, and no earlier than April 15 in 2008 and beyond. It is the intent that scores will be received before the end of the school year, but scores for students in grade 3 and students in grade 12 who are taking the test for graduation purposes shall be returned before the end of the 14 15 school year. Other student scores shall be returned no later than June 15 of each year.
 - (4)(3) STATEWIDE ASSESSMENT PROGRAM. -- The commissioner shall design and implement a statewide program of educational assessment that provides information for the improvement of the operation and management of the public schools, including schools operating for the purpose of providing educational services to youth in Department of Juvenile Justice programs. The commissioner may enter into contracts for the continued administration of the assessment, testing, and evaluation programs authorized and funded by the Legislature. Contracts may be initiated in 1 fiscal year and continue into the next and may be paid from the appropriations of either or both fiscal years. The commissioner is authorized to negotiate for the sale or lease of tests, scoring protocols, test scoring services, and related materials developed pursuant to law. Pursuant to the statewide assessment program, the commissioner

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1 shall:

- testing program known as the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) as part of the statewide assessment program, to be administered annually in grades 3 through 10 to measure reading, writing, science, and mathematics. Other content areas may be included as directed by the commissioner. The assessment of reading and mathematics shall be administered annually in grades 3 through 10. The assessment of writing and science shall be administered at least once at the elementary, middle, and high school levels. The testing program must be designed so that:
- 1. The tests measure student skills and competencies adopted by the State Board of Education as specified in paragraph (a). The tests must measure and report student proficiency levels in reading, writing, mathematics, and science. The commissioner shall provide for the tests to be developed or obtained, as appropriate, through contracts and project agreements with private vendors, public vendors, public agencies, postsecondary educational institutions, or school districts. The commissioner shall obtain input with respect to the design and implementation of the testing program from state educators and the public.
- 2. The testing program will include a combination of norm-referenced and criterion-referenced tests and include, to the extent determined by the commissioner, questions that require the student to produce information or perform tasks in such a way that the skills and competencies he or she uses can be measured.
- 3. Each testing program, whether at the elementary, middle, or high school level, includes a test of writing in

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- which students are required to produce writings that are then scored by appropriate methods.
- 4. A score is designated for each subject area tested, below which score a student's performance is deemed inadequate. The school districts shall provide appropriate remedial instruction to students who score below these levels.
- 5. Except as provided in s. 1003.43(11)(b), students must earn a passing score on the grade 10 assessment test described in this paragraph or on an alternate assessment as described in subsection(10)(9) in reading, writing, and mathematics to qualify for a regular high school diploma. The State Board of Education shall designate a passing score for each part of the grade 10 assessment test. In establishing passing scores, the state board shall consider any possible negative impact of the test on minority students. All students who took the grade 10 FCAT during the 2000-2001 school year shall be required to earn the passing scores in reading and mathematics established by the State Board of Education for the March 2001 test administration. Such students who did not earn the established passing scores and must repeat the grade 10 FCAT are required to earn the passing scores established for the March 2001 test administration. All students who take the grade 10 FCAT for the first time in March 2002 shall be required to earn the passing scores in reading and mathematics established by the State Board of Education for the March 2002 test administration. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules which specify the passing scores for the grade 10 FCAT. Any such rules, which have the effect of raising the required passing scores, shall only apply to students taking the grade 10 FCAT for the first time after such rules are adopted by the State Board of Education.

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1	6. Participation in the testing program is mandatory
2	for all students attending public school, including students
3	served in Department of Juvenile Justice programs, except as
4	otherwise prescribed by the commissioner. If a student does
5	not participate in the statewide assessment, the district must
6	notify the student's parent and provide the parent with
7	information regarding the implications of such
8	nonparticipation. If modifications are made in the student's
9	instruction to provide accommodations that would not be
10	permitted on the statewide assessment tests, the district must
11	notify the student's parent of the implications of such
12	instructional modifications. A parent must provide signed
13	consent for a student to receive instructional modifications
14	that would not be permitted on the statewide assessments and
15	must acknowledge in writing that he or she understands the
16	implications of such accommodations. The State Board of
17	Education shall adopt rules, based upon recommendations of the
18	commissioner, for the provision of test accommodations and
19	modifications of procedures as necessary for students in
20	exceptional education programs and for students who have
21	limited English proficiency. Accommodations that negate the
22	validity of a statewide assessment are not allowable.

- $7.\,\,$ A student seeking an adult high school diploma must meet the same testing requirements that a regular high school student must meet.
- 8. District school boards must provide instruction to prepare students to demonstrate proficiency in the skills and competencies necessary for successful grade-to-grade progression and high school graduation. If a student is provided with accommodations or modifications that are not allowable in the statewide assessment program, as described in

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the test manuals, the district must inform the parent in
writing and must provide the parent with information regarding
the impact on the student's ability to meet expected
proficiency levels in reading, writing, and math. The
commissioner shall conduct studies as necessary to verify that
the required skills and competencies are part of the district
instructional programs.

9. The Department of Education must develop, or select, and implement a common battery of assessment tools that will be used in all juvenile justice programs in the state. These tools must accurately measure the skills and competencies established in the Florida Sunshine State Standards.

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The commissioner may design and implement student testing programs, for any grade level and subject area, necessary to effectively monitor educational achievement in the state.

(e) Conduct ongoing research and analysis of student achievement data, including, without limitation, monitoring trends in student achievement by grade level and overall student achievement, identifying school programs that are successful, and analyzing correlates of school achievement.

(10)(9) EQUIVALENCIES FOR STANDARDIZED TESTS.--

(a) The State Board of Education shall conduct concordance studies, as necessary, to determine scores on the SAT and the ACT equivalent to those required on the FCAT for high school graduation pursuant to s. 1003.429(6)(a) or s. 1003.43(5)(a).

(b)(a) The Commissioner of Education shall approve the use of the SAT and ACT tests as alternative assessments to the grade 10 FCAT for the 2003-2004 school year. Students who

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1	attain scores on the SAT or ACT which equate to the passing
2	scores on the grade 10 FCAT for purposes of high school
3	graduation shall satisfy the assessment requirement for a
4	standard high school diploma as provided in s. 1003.429(6)(a)
5	or s. 1003.43(5)(a) for the 2003-2004 school year if the
6	students meet the requirement in $paragraph(c)$ (b).
7	(c)(b) A student shall be required to take <u>each</u>
8	subject area of the grade 10 FCAT a total of three times
9	without earning a passing score in order to use the
10	corresponding subject area scores on an alternative assessment
11	pursuant to $paragraph(b)(a)$. This requirement shall not
12	apply to a <u>new</u> student who <u>enters</u> is a new student to the
13	Florida public school system in grade 12, who may either take
14	the FCAT or use approved score equivalencies to fulfill the
15	graduation requirement.
