29	(2) Except as provided in subsection (4), access to
30	such records, excluding the name of the reporter which shall
31	be released only as provided in subsection (5), shall be
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1 granted only to the following persons, officials, and 2 agencies: (q) Staff of a children's advocacy center that is 3 established and operated under s. 39.3035. 4 5 Section 2. Subsection (22) is added to section 39.301, б Florida Statutes, to read: 7 39.301 Initiation of protective investigations.--8 (22) When an investigation is closed and a person is not identified as a caregiver responsible for the abuse, 9 10 neglect, or abandonment alleged in the report, the fact that the person is named in some capacity in the report may not be 11 12 used in any way to adversely affect the interests of that 13 person. This prohibition applies to any use of the information in employment screening, licensing, child placement, adoption, 14 or any other decisions by a private adoption agency or a state 15 agency or its contracted providers. 16 17 Section 3. Subsection (7) is added to section 39.302, 18 Florida Statutes, to read: 19 39.302 Protective investigations of institutional child abuse, abandonment, or neglect .--20 21 (7) When an investigation of institutional abuse, 2.2 neglect, or abandonment is closed and a person is not 23 identified as a caregiver responsible for the abuse, neglect, or abandonment alleged in the report, the fact that the person 2.4 is named in some capacity in the report may not be used in any 25 way to adversely affect the interests of that person. This 26 27 prohibition applies to any use of the information in 2.8 employment screening, licensing, child placement, adoption, or any other decisions by a private adoption agency or a state 29 agency or its contracted providers. If such a person is a 30 licensee of the department and is named in any capacity in 31

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three or more reports within a 5-year period, the department 1 2 may review those reports and determine whether the information 3 contained in the reports is relevant for purposes of 4 determining whether the person's license should be renewed or 5 revoked. If the information is relevant to the decision to renew or revoke the license, the department may rely on the б 7 information contained in the report in making that decision. 8 Section 4.
