K-12 students and their parents are afforded numerous 18 statutory rights including, but not limited to, the following: (3) HEALTH ISSUES.--19 (i) Epinephrine use. -- A student who has experienced or 20 21 is at risk for life-threatening allergic reactions may carry 22 an epinephrine auto-injector and self-administer epinephrine 23 by auto-injector while in school, participating in school-sponsored activities, or in transit to or from school 2.4 or school-sponsored activities if the school has been provided 25 26 with parental and physician authorization.
