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13	WHEREAS, the management of the water resources of the
14	state is critical to preserving this state's unique natural
15	systems and to protecting the health and welfare of the people

17	WHEREAS, the Legislature has enacted into law a series
18	of water resource planning and regulatory programs aimed at
19	protecting, preserving, restoring, and enhancing the state's
20	water resources, and
21	WHEREAS, the Legislature has also enacted laws to
22	encourage conservation, the efficient use of water, and the
23	development of cost-effective alternative water supply
24	technologies in order to minimize dependence upon historic
25	water supply sources, and
26	WHEREAS, despite these efforts, the future availability
27	of water necessary to maintain the state's natural systems,
28	and to meet the future demands of the state's agricultural and
29	urban areas, remains in question, and
30	WHEREAS, regular evaluation of the Florida Water Plan
31	and district or regional water supply plans, including the

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alternative water supply development provisions, is necessary 2 to determine whether state goals are being attained and to ensure that necessary revisions are prepared through 3 coordinated action by state and regional agencies and local 4 5 governments, and 6 WHEREAS, local and regional governments throughout the 7 state repeatedly request funding assistance from the state to 8 address water, wastewater, and stormwater infrastructure 9 needs, and 10 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that there is a need to comprehensively consider how the multibillion dollar water 11 12 resources infrastructure needs are to be met in order to 13 preserve and enhance the quality of the state's water resources and protect the health and welfare of the people of 14 the state, NOW, THEREFORE, 15 16 17 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 18 Section 1. (1) The 2020 Water Study Commission is 19 20 created. The commission shall be composed of 17 voting 21 members, 7 of whom are appointed by the Governor, 5 of whom 22 are appointed by the President of the Senate, and 5 of whom 23 are appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. In addition, the Commissioner of Agriculture, the Secretary of 2.4 Community Affairs, and the Secretary of Environmental 2.5 Protection or their designees shall serve as ex officio, 26 27 nonvoting members of the commission. The Governor's 2.8 appointments must include at least one appointment from each 29 of the following interest groups: 30 (a) Business interests, such as development or real

1	(b) Agricultural interests, such as farming, forestry,
2	aquaculture, or silvaculture.
3	(c) Environmental interests, such as resource-based
4	conservation and environmental quality or conservation groups.
5	(d) Community representatives, such as citizen groups,
6	not-for-profit community associations, citizen planners, or
7	affordable housing groups.
8	(e) Local and regional governments, such as
9	municipalities, counties, special districts, metropolitan
10	planning organizations, water management districts, or
11	regional planning councils.
12	(f) Water resources management and planning
13	specialists, such as professional planners, attorneys,
14	engineers, or architects.
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16	The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
17	Representatives shall each select one appointee from five of
18	the six categories listed in paragraphs (a)-(f) and, in
19	addition, shall each appoint two members from their respective
20	chambers of the Legislature to serve on the commission as ex
21	officio, nonvoting members. Appointments under this subsection
22	shall be made by July 1, 2005, and the first meeting of the
23	commission shall be held no later than September 1, 2005. The
24	chair of the commission shall be elected from the voting
25	members by the majority of the voting members present at the
26	commission's first meeting. Any vacancy occurring in the
27	membership of the commission shall be filled in the same
28	manner as the original appointment.
29	(2) Each voting member of the commission is entitled
30	to one vote, and action of the commission requires a
31	two-thirds vote of the voting members present. Action of the

Τ	commission may be taken only at a meeting at which a majority
2	of the voting commission members are present.
3	(3) The commission shall review the operation and
4	implementation of this state's water resource management and
5	planning laws, including, but not limited to, chapters 163,
6	373, and 403, Florida Statutes, for the purpose of formulating
7	specific recommendations relating to:
8	(a) Funding for the cleanup of all the water bodies
9	that have been determined by the Department of Environmental
10	Protection pursuant to section 403.067, Florida Statutes, to
11	be impaired;
12	(b) Identifying regulatory and financial incentives to
13	local governments to increase the amount of water utility
14	collection fees dedicated to the implementation of
15	conservation, efficient water use, and water-reclamation
16	projects;
17	(c) Simplifying and streamlining permitting processes
18	at both the state and federal levels for alternative water
19	<pre>supply technologies;</pre>
20	(d) Increasing water reuse, including resolving
21	disputes relating to determining the feasibility of
22	infrastructure financing and development and the colocation of
23	<pre>power generating facilities;</pre>
24	(e) Identifying the appropriate role of the state in
25	assisting local governments in implementing alternative water
26	supply projects, including, without limitation, providing
27	additional financial and technical assistance;
28	(f) Promoting cost-effective agricultural water
29	conservation and efficiency practices, including providing
30	long-term funding support for the Urban Irrigation Laboratory
31	Programs; and

Τ	(q) Providing public education about, and increasing
2	public participation in, programs that promote the protection
3	and conservation of water resources, including those that
4	increase efficiency in the various water uses.
5	(4) At least six public hearings must be held by the
6	commission in different regions of the state to solicit public
7	input as to how residents want the state, regional agencies,
8	and municipalities and counties to provide for the protection
9	and enhancement of the state's water resources.
10	(5) The commission shall, by February 1, 2006, provide
11	to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
12	Representatives, and the Governor an interim written report of
13	the specific recommendations that may be formulated at that
14	time. A final written report shall be provided to the same
15	officers by February 1, 2007, with recommendations for all the
16	issues identified in paragraphs (3)(a)-(q), including
17	legislative recommendations.
18	(6) The commission may establish and appoint any
19	necessary technical advisory committees. Commission members,
20	and the members of any technical advisory committees that are
21	appointed, shall not receive remuneration for their services,
22	but commission and committee members other than public
23	officers and employees are entitled to be reimbursed by the
24	Department of Environmental Protection for travel or per diem
25	expenses incurred while carrying out official business of the
26	commission in accordance with chapter 112, Florida Statutes.
27	Public officers and employees shall be reimbursed by their
28	respective agencies in accordance with chapter 112, Florida
29	Statutes.
30	(7) The commission may select an executive director
31	who shall report to the commission and serve at its pleasure.

1	The Department of Environmental Protection shall provide other
2	staff and consultants after consultation with the commission.
3	Funding for these expenses shall be provided through the
4	Department of Environmental Protection.
5	(8) All agencies under the control of the Governor are
6	directed, and all other agencies are requested, to render
7	assistance and cooperation to the commission.
8	(9) The commission shall continue in existence until
9	its objectives are achieved, but not later than September 1,
10	<u>2007.</u>
11	Section 2. The sum of \$250,000 is appropriated from
12	the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Environmental
13	Protection for the purpose of implementing this act.
14	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a
15	law.
