| 16 | (1) For purposes of this section, the term "alcohol            |
| 17 | vaporizing device means any device, machine, or process that   |
| 18 | mixes spirits, liquor, or other alcohol products with pure     |
| 19 | oxygen or other gas to produce a vaporized product for the     |
| 20 | purpose of consumption by inhalation.                          |
| 21 | (2) A person may not sell, offer for sale, purchase,           |
| 22 | or use an alcohol vaporizing device.                           |
| 23 | (3)(a) Any person who violates this section by selling         |
| 24 | or offering for sale an alcohol vaporizing device commits a    |
| 25 | misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.  |
| 26 | 775.082 or s. 775.083. Any person who violates this section by |
| 27 | selling or offering for sale an alcohol vaporizing device      |
| 28 | after having been previously convicted of such an offense      |
| 29 | within the past 5 years commits a felony of the third degree,  |
