23 Regulation.--There is created a Department of Business and
24 Professional Regulation.

25 (9)(a) All employees authorized by the Division of 26 Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco shall have access to, and shall 27 have the right to inspect, premises licensed by the division, to collect taxes and remit them to the officers entitled to them, 28 and to examine the books and records of all licensees. The 29 30 authorized employees shall require of each licensee strict compliance with the laws of this state relating to the 31 32 transaction of such business.

33 (b) Each employee serving as a law enforcement officer for 34 the division must meet the qualifications for employment or 35 appointment as a law enforcement officer set forth under s. 36 943.13 and must be certified as a law enforcement officer by the 37 Department of Law Enforcement under chapter 943. Upon certification, each law enforcement officer is subject to and 38 has the same authority as provided for law enforcement officers 39 40 generally in chapter 901 and has statewide jurisdiction. Each officer also has arrest authority as provided for state law 41 enforcement officers in s. 901.15. Each officer possesses the 42 43 full law enforcement powers granted to other peace officers of this state, including the authority to make arrests, carry 44 45 firearms, serve court process, and seize contraband and the proceeds of illegal activities. All employees certified under 46 chapter 943 as law enforcement officers shall have the primary 47 responsibility felony arrest powers under s. 901.15(10) and 48 49 shall have all the powers of deputy sheriffs to: Page 2 of 3

50 1. investigate, enforce, and prosecute, throughout the 51 state, violations and violators of:

52 <u>1.a.</u> Parts I and II of chapter 210; part VII of chapter 53 559; and chapters 561-569; and the rules <u>adopted</u> promulgated 54 thereunder, as well as other state laws <u>that</u> which the division, 55 all state law enforcement officers, or beverage enforcement 56 agents are specifically authorized to enforce.

57 <u>2.b.</u> All other state laws, provided that the employee 58 exercises the powers of a deputy sheriff, only after 59 consultation <u>or and in</u> coordination with the appropriate local 60 sheriff's office, and only if the violation could result in an 61 administrative proceeding against a license or permit issued by 62 the division.

63 2. Enforce all criminal laws of the state within specified
64 jurisdictions when the division is a party to a written mutual
65 aid agreement with a state agency, sheriff, or municipal police
66 department, or when the division participates in the Florida
67 Mutual Aid Plan during a declared state emergency.
