Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (9) of section
20.165, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

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CS 20.165 Department of Business and Professional 23 24 Regulation.--There is created a Department of Business and Professional Regulation. 25 26 (9) (b) Each employee serving as a law enforcement officer for 27 28 the division must meet the qualifications for employment or appointment as a law enforcement officer set forth under s. 29 943.13 and must be certified as a law enforcement officer by the 30 Department of Law Enforcement under chapter 943. Upon 31 32 certification, each law enforcement officer is subject to and 33 has the same authority as provided for law enforcement officers 34 generally in chapter 901 and has statewide jurisdiction. Each 35 officer also has arrest authority as provided for state law 36 enforcement officers in s. 901.15. Each officer possesses the 37 full law enforcement powers granted to other peace officers of this state, including the authority to make arrests, carry 38 firearms, serve court process, and seize contraband and the 39 proceeds of illegal activities. 40 41 1. The primary responsibility of each officer appointed under this section is All employees certified under chapter 943 42 as law enforcement officers shall have felony arrest powers 43 44 under s. 901.15(10) and shall have all the powers of deputy 45 sheriffs to: investigate, enforce, and prosecute, throughout the 46 <del>1.</del> state, violations and violators of + 47 a. parts I and II of chapter 210, + part VII of chapter 48 559,  $\div$  and chapters 561-569,  $\div$  and the rules <u>adopted</u> promulgated 49 50 thereunder, as well as other state laws that which the division, Page 2 of 3

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all state law enforcement officers, or beverage enforcement 51 52 agents are specifically authorized to enforce. The secondary responsibility of each officer 53 2.<del>b.</del> 54 appointed under this section is to enforce all other state laws, provided that the enforcement is incidental to exercising the 55 56 officer's primary responsibility as provided in subparagraph 1., 57 and the officer employee exercises the powers of a deputy sheriff, only after consultation or and in coordination with the 58 appropriate local sheriff's office, and only if the violation 59 60 could result in an administrative proceeding against a license 61 or permit issued by the division.

62 2. Enforce all criminal laws of the state within specified
63 jurisdictions when the division is a party to a written mutual
64 aid agreement with a state agency, sheriff, or municipal police
65 department, or when the division participates in the Florida
66 Mutual Aid Plan during a declared state emergency.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.

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
