2	An act relating to youth and young adults with
3	disabilities; creating the Interagency Services
4	Committee for Youth and Young Adults with
5	Disabilities; providing legislative intent;
б	providing that the committee be staffed by
7	member agencies of the committee; providing for
8	the membership of the committee; providing
9	duties and responsibilities for the committee;
10	requiring the committee to submit a report to
11	the Governor and the Legislature; providing an
12	effective date.
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14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Interagency Services Committee for Youth
17	and Young Adults with Disabilities
18	(1) There is created in the Agency for Persons with
19	Disabilities the Interagency Services Committee for Youth and
20	Young Adults with Disabilities. It is the intent of the
21	Legislature that the committee establish goals to ensure
22	successful transition to employment or further education of
23	youth and young adults with disabilities and to eliminate
24	barriers that impede educational opportunities leading to
25	future employment.
26	(2)(a) The committee shall consist of heads, or their
27	designees, of the following agencies and bureaus or divisions
28	of agencies: the Department of Education and, in that
29	department, the Bureau of Exceptional Education and Student
30	Services, the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation, the
31	Division of Blind Services, the Division of Community

1	<u>Colleges, workforce education, and the office of interagency</u>
2	programs; the Agency for Persons with Disabilities; the Agency
3	for Health Care Administration; the Division of Children's
4	Medical Services Network in the Department of Health;
5	<u>children's mental health in the Department of Children and</u>
6	Family Services; the Department of Juvenile Justice; the
7	Department of Corrections; the Commission for the
8	Transportation Disadvantaged; and the Florida Housing Finance
9	Corporation. Agency representatives must be at least at the
10	bureau chief level. The committee shall invite representation
11	from the following private and public parties: the Able Trust;
12	the Business Leadership Network; the Florida Advocacy Center;
13	the Governor's Americans with Disabilities Act Working Group;
14	the Florida Association for Centers for Independent Living; an
15	individual with a disability; and a parent or quardian of an
16	individual with a disability. The members of the committee
17	shall designate one of its members as chairperson.
18	(b) The Department of Children and Family Services,
19	the Department of Education, the Department of Health, and the
20	Agency for Persons with Disabilities shall provide staff
21	support to the committee. Meetings and records of the
22	committee are subject to ss. 119.07 and 286.011, Florida
23	Statutes. The chairperson may designate one of the agencies
24	providing staff support to perform administrative
25	responsibilities for the committee.
26	(c) Committee members shall serve without compensation
27	but are entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in
28	carrying out their duties as provided in s. 112.061, Florida
29	Statutes. Members who are public officers or employees shall
30	be reimbursed through the budget entity through which they are
31	compensated. Reimbursement for members who are not public
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1	officers or employees shall alternate between the budget
2	entities represented on the committee.
3	(3) The committee shall:
4	(a) Identify the roles and responsibilities of each
5	agency with regard to the committee goals.
б	(b) Develop collaborative relationships to identify
7	and assist in removing federal and state barriers to achieving
8	the goals.
9	(c) Identify common or comparable performance measures
10	for all agencies that serve youth and young adults with
11	disabilities.
12	(d) Design a mechanism to annually assess the progress
13	toward the goals by each agency.
14	(e) Collect and disseminate information on
15	research-based practices of state and local agencies on
16	successful strategies.
17	(f) Develop strategies to educate public and private
18	employers on the benefit of hiring persons with disabilities.
19	(q) Develop strategies to encourage each public
20	employer to hire persons with disabilities.
21	(h) Recommend a statewide system of accountability
22	which would include incentives for persons with disabilities;
23	service providers, including school districts, technical
24	centers, and community colleges; and businesses and industries
25	providing integrated competitive employment to individuals
26	with disabilities.
27	(4) The committee shall present a report of its
28	progress to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the
29	Speaker of the House of Representatives by March 1, 2007, and
30	a final report on its findings and recommendations by January
31	1, 2008. The committee is abolished on June 1, 2008.

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1	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
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3	STATEMENT OF SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR
4	Senate Bill 1278
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6	Creates the committee in the Agency for Persons with Disabilities.
7	Modifies composition of the committee.
8	Clarifies that the committee is advisory.
9	Provides for a progress report and a final report.
10	Abolishes the committee June 1, 2008.
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
