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21	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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23	Section 1. Section 465.014, Florida Statutes, is
24	amended to read:
25	465.014 Pharmacy technician
26	(1) A No person other than a licensed pharmacist or
27	pharmacy intern may $\underline{\text{not}}$ engage in the practice of the
28	profession of pharmacy, except that a licensed pharmacist may
29	delegate to nonlicensed pharmacy technicians registered
30	pursuant to this section those duties, tasks, and functions
31	which do not fall within the purview of s. 465.003(13). All

such delegated acts shall be performed under the direct 2 supervision of a licensed pharmacist who shall be responsible for all such acts performed by persons under his or her 3 supervision. A registered pharmacy technician, under the 4 supervision of a pharmacist, may initiate or receive 5 6 communications with a practitioner or his or her agent, on 7 behalf of a patient, regarding refill authorization requests. 8 A No licensed pharmacist may not shall supervise more than one registered pharmacy technician unless otherwise permitted by 9 10 the guidelines adopted by the board. The board shall establish quidelines to be followed by licensees or permittees in 11 12 determining the circumstances under which a licensed 13 pharmacist may supervise more than one but not more than three registered pharmacy technicians. 14 15

- (2) Any person who wishes to work as a pharmacy technician in this state shall register by filing an application with the board on a form furnished by the board.

 The board shall register each applicant who has remitted a registration fee set by the board, not to exceed \$50 biennially, has completed the application form and remitted a nonrefundable application fee set by the board, not to exceed \$25, and meets the following requirements:
 - (a) Is at least 18 years of age.
 - (b) Is a high school graduate or equivalent.
- (c) Within the 5 years preceding application, has had no conviction or pleading of quilt, and has never entered a plea of nolo contendere, regardless of adjudication, for a crime that relates to drug trafficking or otherwise directly relates to the functions and duties of a pharmacy technician.

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(3) A pharmacist whose license has been denied, suspended, or restricted for disciplinary purposes is not eliqible to be registered as a pharmacy technician.

- (4) Notwithstanding the requirements of this section or any other provision of law, a pharmacy technician student may be placed in a pharmacy for the purpose of obtaining practical training required by the body accrediting the pharmacy technician training program. A pharmacy technician student shall wear identification that indicates his or her student status, and registration under this section is not required.
- (5) Notwithstanding the requirements of this section or any other provision of law, a person who works as an unpaid volunteer under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist may perform the functions of a pharmacy technician without paying a registration fee or filing an application with the board to register as a pharmacy technician, provided that the board maintains a register that lists the name of each volunteer and documents each volunteer's period of service.
- (6) Notwithstanding the requirements of this section or any other provision of law, a person licensed by the state as a pharmacy intern may be employed as a registered pharmacy technician without paying a registration fee or filing an application with the board to register as a pharmacy technician.
- (7) As a condition of registration renewal, a pharmacy technician shall complete 20 hours biennially of continuing education courses approved by the board or the American Council on Pharmaceutical Education, of which 4 hours must be via live presentation and 2 hours must be related to the prevention of medication errors and pharmacy law.

1	(8) The board shall adopt rules that require each
2	registration issued by the board under this section to be
3	displayed in such a manner as to make it available to the
4	public and to facilitate inspection by the board.
5	(9) The following acts constitute grounds for denial
6	of registration of a pharmacy technician:
7	(a) Being unfit or incompetent to work as a pharmacy
8	technician by reason of:
9	1. Habitual intoxication.
10	2. The misuse or abuse of any medicinal drug appearing
11	in any schedule set forth in chapter 893.
12	3. Any abnormal physical or mental condition that
13	threatens the safety of persons to whom he or she might sell
14	or assist a pharmacist in dispensing prescriptions, drugs, or
15	medical supplies or for whom he or she might assist a
16	pharmacist in preparing or packaging prescriptions, drugs, or
17	medical supplies.

25	(5) All institutional pharmacies shall be under the
26	professional supervision of a consultant pharmacist, and the
27	compounding and dispensing of medicinal drugs shall be done
28	only by a licensed pharmacist. Every institutional pharmacy
29	that employs or otherwise utilizes registered pharmacy
30	technicians shall have a written policy and procedures manual
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specifying those duties, tasks, and functions which a pharmacy technician is allowed to perform.

Section 3. Section 465.0196, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

465.0196 Special pharmacy permits.--Any person desiring a permit to operate a special pharmacy shall apply to the department for a special pharmacy permit. If the board certifies that the application complies with the applicable laws and rules of the board governing the practice of the profession of pharmacy, the department shall issue the permit. No permit shall be issued unless a licensed pharmacist is designated to undertake the professional supervision of the compounding and dispensing of all drugs dispensed by the pharmacy. The licensed pharmacist shall be responsible for maintaining all drug records and for providing for the security of the area in the facility in which the compounding, storing, and dispensing of medicinal drugs occurs. The permittee shall notify the department within 10 days of any change of the licensed pharmacist responsible for such duties. Every permittee that employs or otherwise utilizes pharmacy technicians shall have a written policy and procedures manual specifying those duties, tasks, and functions which a registered pharmacy technician is allowed to perform.

465.0197 Internet pharmacy permits.--

Statutes, is amended to read:

(1) Any person desiring a permit to operate an Internet pharmacy shall apply to the department for an Internet pharmacy permit. If the board certifies that the application complies with the applicable laws and rules of the board governing the practice of the profession of pharmacy,

the department shall issue the permit. No permit shall be issued unless a licensed pharmacist is designated as the prescription department manager for dispensing medicinal drugs to persons in this state. The licensed pharmacist shall be responsible for maintaining all drug records and for providing for the security of the area in the facility in which the compounding, storing, and dispensing of medicinal drugs to persons in this state occurs. The permittee shall notify the department within 30 days of any change of the licensed pharmacist responsible for such duties. Every permittee that employs or otherwise utilizes registered pharmacy technicians shall have a written policy and procedures manual specifying those duties, tasks, and functions which a registered pharmacy technician is allowed to perform.

Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.

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SENATE SUMMARY

Requires a pharmacy technician to be registered with the Board of Pharmacy. Providing requirements for registration. Prohibits a pharmacist whose license has been suspended, denied, or restricted for disciplinary purposes from registering as a pharmacy technician. Authorizes a pharmacy technician student to be trained in a pharmacy under certain conditions. Authorizes a volunteer to perform functions as a pharmacy technician under certain conditions. Provides that a pharmacy intern may be employed as a pharmacy technician without being registered as a pharmacy technician under certain conditions. Provides grounds for denial of registration as a pharmacy technician.
