1 The Environmental Regulation Committee recommends the following: 2 3 Council/Committee Substitute Remove the entire bill and insert: 4 5 A bill to be entitled 6 An act relating to the Wekiva Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System Compliance Grant Program; creating the 7 program in the Department of Health; providing purposes; 8 9 authorizing certain property owners in certain areas of 10 the Wekiva basin to apply for grants for certain purposes; providing grant limitations; providing for annual 11 adjustments of the amount of the grants; providing for the 12 grant as a rebate of costs incurred; requiring 13 14 documentation of costs; requiring the Department of Health to adopt rules to administer the grant program; requiring 15 the Department of Environmental Protection to conduct a 16 17 study of sources of nitrogen input into the Wekiva River and associated springs; requiring the Department of Health 18 to contract for an independent study of sources of 19 nitrogen input from onsite sewage treatment and disposal 20 21 systems into the Wekiva River and associated springs; requiring reports; providing report requirements; 22 23 requiring the Department of Environmental Protection and Page 1 of 5

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24 Department of Health to submit copies of the reports to 25 the Legislature; requiring the Department of Health to 26 develop proposed rules for a model proposal applying to 27 operation and maintenance of onsite sewage treatment and 28 disposal systems in certain areas; specifying a rule 29 criterion; providing appropriations; providing an 30 effective date.

32 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

34 Section 1. <u>Wekiva Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal</u>
35 System Compliance Grant Program.--

36 The Wekiva Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal System (1) Compliance Grant Program is created within the Department of 37 38 Health, to be administered by the Department of Health. The purpose of the program is to provide grants to low-income 39 40 property owners in the Wekiva Study Area or the Wekiva River Protection Area using onsite sewage treatment and disposal 41 42 systems to assist the property owner in complying with rules for onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems developed by the 43 Department of Health, the Department of Environmental 44 45 Protection, or the St. Johns River Water Management District to 46 enforce compliance with onsite sewage treatment and disposal 47 system standards. Any property owner in the Wekiva Study Area or the 48 (2) Wekiva River Protection Area having an income less than or equal 49 50 to 200 percent of the federal poverty quideline who is required by rule of the Department of Health, the Department of 51

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CS 52 Environmental Protection, or the St. Johns River Water Management District to construct, reconstruct, alter, repair, or 53 modify any new or existing onsite sewage treatment and disposal 54 55 system on such property may apply to the Department of Health 56 for a grant to assist the owner with the cost of compliance. The amount of the grant is limited to \$10,000 per 57 (3) 58 property and shall be increased each calendar year by the change 59 in the annual average of the "materials and components for construction" series of the producer price index, as calculated 60 and published by the United States Department of Labor, Bureau 61 62 of Statistics, from the previous calendar year. The grant shall be in the form of a rebate to the 63 (4) 64 property owner for costs incurred in complying with requirements 65 for onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems. The property 66 owner shall provide to the Department of Health in the 67 application for a grant documentation of costs incurred in 68 complying with requirements for such systems. 69 The Department of Health shall adopt rules pursuant to (5) ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 providing forms, procedures, and 70 71 requirements for applying for and disbursing grants under this section and for documenting compliance costs incurred. 72 73 Section 2. (1) (a) The Department of Environmental Protection shall conduct a study to determine the various 74 75 sources of nitrogen input into the Wekiva River and associated 76 springs contributing water to the river. The Department of 77 Environmental Protection shall prepare a report recommending 78 actions to be taken by the Department of Environmental 79 Protection and the St. Johns Water Management District that will Page 3 of 5

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CS 80 provide the best use of economic resources to reduce nitrogen 81 inputs into the river and associated springs. (b) The Department of Health shall contract for a study by 82 83 an independent entity of sources of input of nitrogen from onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems into the Wekiva 84 85 River and associated springs. The study shall measure the 86 concentration of nitrates in the soil 10 feet and 20 feet below 87 the drainage field of the onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems. The contract shall require the entity to submit a 88 report to the Department of Health describing the locations of 89 90 such sources and amounts contributed by such sources and containing recommendations to reduce or eliminate nitrogen 91 92 inputs from such sources. 93 The Department of Environmental Protection and the (C) 94 Department of Health shall submit copies of the reports to the 95 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives before the 2007 Regular Session of the 96 97 Legislature. 98 (2) The Department of Health shall develop proposed rules for a model proposal applying to operation and maintenance of 99 100 onsite sewage treatment and disposal systems within the Wekiva 101 Study Area or the Wekiva River Protection Area. At a minimum, 102 the rules shall require each property owner in the Wekiva Study 103 Area or the Wekiva River Protection Area having an onsite sewage 104 treatment and disposal system to pump out the system at least 105 once every 5 years. 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108 2007 fiscal year, of which \$ shall be used by the 109 Department of Health to administer the Wekiva Onsite Sewage 110 Treatment and Disposal System Compliance Grant Program and \$ 111 shall be used to provide grants to applicants under the 112 program. The sum of \$ is appropriated from the General 113 (2)(a) Revenue Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection for 114 115 the 2006-2007 fiscal year to be used by the Department of Environmental Protection to conduct the study required under 116 117 paragraph (1)(a) of section 2. 118 (b) The sum of \$ is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Health for the 2006-2007 119 120 fiscal year to be used for purposes of the independent study the Department of Health is required to contract for under paragraph 121 122 (1)(b) of section 2. Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006. 123

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
