I. Summary:

The bill designates the new alumni center at the Boca Raton campus of Florida Atlantic University (FAU) as the "Marleen and Harold Forkas Alumni Center" and directs the university to erect suitable markers making the respective building designation.

This bill creates an undesignated section of Florida law. The Division of Statutory Revision will determine whether it is included in the Florida Statutes.

The bill takes effect on July 1, 2006.

II. Present Situation:

Section 267.062, F.S., requires approval in law before naming a state building or other facility for a living person. Pursuant to this requirement, if a university wishes to name a building or facility after a living person, the designation must be approved by the Legislature.

As the first woman to graduate from the Fashion Institute of Technology's Management Engineering Division, Marleen Forkas had a 40-year career as a designer and manufacturer for some of the leading fashion houses. Harold Forkas worked in the office supply business, had a sales and management career with Coca-Cola, and owned eight Midas Muffler dealerships when

he retired in 1988.

Marleen and Harold Forkas are involved in many charitable organizations such as the Boca Raton Community Hospital Foundation, the Boca Raton Museum of Art, and many cultural arts organizations. In 1997, they became involved with programs at FAU's University Center. Later they became a part of the Inner Circle of Football Founders. The FAU National Alumni Association recently received a \$1 million gift from Marleen and Harold Forkas in support of FAU's alumni center.

The bill designates the new alumni center at FAU's Boca Raton campus as the "Marleen and Harold Forkas Alumni Center" and directs the university to erect suitable markers making the respective building designation.
