26	preparatory program requiring successful completion of a

28	least 6 of the 18 credits required for completion of this
29	program must be received in classes that are <u>offered pursuant</u>
30	to the International Baccalaureate Program, the Advanced
31	<u>Placement Program</u> honors , dual enrollment, advanced placement, 1
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1	International Baccalaureate, Advanced International
2	Certificate of Education, or specifically listed or identified
3	by the Department of Education as rigorous pursuant to s.
4	1009.531(3), or weighted by the district school board for
5	class ranking purposes. The 18 credits required for completion
6	of this program shall be primary requirements and shall be
7	distributed as follows:
8	1. Four credits in English, with major concentration
9	in composition and literature;
10	2. Three credits in mathematics at the Algebra I level
11	or higher from the list of courses that qualify for state
12	university admission;
13	3. Three credits in natural science, two of which must
14	have a laboratory component;

16	include one credit in American history, one credit in world

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1 The student shall submit to the high school 2 principal and guidance counselor a signed parental consent to enter the 3-year accelerated graduation program. 3 4 (c) The student shall have achieved at least an FCAT 5 reading achievement level of 3, an FCAT mathematics achievement level of 3, and an FCAT Writing score of 3 on the 6 7 most recent assessments taken by the student. (3) Beginning with the <u>2006-2007</u> 2004-2005 school 8 year, each district school board shall provide each student in 9 10 grades 6 through 9 and their parents with information 11 concerning the 3-year and 4-year high school graduation options listed in subsection (1), including the respective 12 13 curriculum requirements for those options, so that the students and their parents may select the program 14 15 postsecondary education or career plan that best fits their needs. The information must shall include a timeframe for 16 achieving each graduation option. 17 18 (4) Selection of one of the graduation options listed 19 in subsection (1) must be completed by the student prior to 20 the end of grade 9 and is exclusively up to the student and parent, subject to the requirements in subsection (2). Each 21 22 district school board shall establish policies for extending this deadline to the end of a student's first semester of 23 2.4 grade 10 for a student who entered a Florida public school after grade 9 upon transfer from a private school or another 25 state or who was prevented from choosing a graduation option 26 due to illness during grade 9. 22	fails to earn 11 credits by the end of grade 10;
23	(c) Does not achieve a score of 3 or higher on the
24	grade 10 FCAT Writing assessment; or
25	(d) By the end of grade 11 does not meet the
26	requirements of subsections (1) and (6).
27	(9) A student who meets all requirements prescribed in
28	subsections (1) and (6) shall be awarded a standard diploma in
29	a form prescribed by the State Board of Education.
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
