561.422 Nonprofit civic organizations; temporary 5 permits.--Upon the filing of an application, presentation of a 6 7 local building and zoning permit, and payment of a fee of \$25 per permit, the director of the division may issue a permit 8 authorizing a bona fide nonprofit civic organization to sell 9 10 alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises only, for 11 a period not to exceed 3 days, subject to any state law or municipal or county ordinance regulating the time for selling 12 13 such beverages. All net profits from sales of alcoholic beverages collected during the permit period must be retained 14 15 by the nonprofit civic organization. Any such civic organization may be issued only three such permits per 16 calendar year. The director of the division may issue a permit 17 to such civic organization more than three times per calendar 18 19 year, but not more than 15 times per calendar year, upon the 20 approval of the incorporated city, town, or board of county commissioners that has jurisdiction over the location of the 21 22 premises. Notwithstanding other provisions of the Beverage Law, any civic organization licensed under this section may 23 2.4 purchase alcoholic beverages from a distributor or vendor licensed under the Beverage Law. 25 Section 3.
