(1) It is the intent of the Legislature to 22 encourage small businesses to provide comprehensive major 23 medical health insurance coverage to employees of the businesses. It is the intent of this act to establish a 2.4 statewide pilot program that will allocate \$15 million from 2.5 general revenue for such purposes. 26 27 (2) The Small Business Health Care Insurance 2.8 Assistance Pilot Program is created as a statewide pilot program for a period of 2 years to provide a one-time rebate 29 for small businesses that employ more than one but fewer than 30 six employees and that provide full coverage of comprehensive

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major medical health insurance for such employees pursuant to 2 627.6699, Florida Statutes. The employer shall pay at least 50 percent but less than 100 percent of the cost of the 3 4 coverage, and the employees must share in the remainder of the cost of the coverage. 5 6 (3)(a) The amount of the rebate shall be \$1,000 per 7 each employee as reported on the business's Florida 8 unemployment compensation tax form 6. 9 (b) A small business must apply through the Agency for 10 <u>Health Care Administration.</u> (c) A business is eligible for the rebate under this 11 12 section if, at the time of applying for a rebate under the 13 pilot program, the business had provided and paid for such coverage for 12 consecutive months but had not provided and 14 paid for such coverage for at least 6 months prior to such 15 12-month period. The business may apply only once for the 16 17 rebate. (4) The pilot program shall be funded by general 18 revenue and shall be administered by the Agency for Health 19 Care Administration. The agency shall adopt any rules pursuant 2.0 21 to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54, Florida Statutes, necessary to 2.2 administer and ensure accountability of the pilot program and 23 enforce compliance with the requirements of the program. The agency may conduct audits of any business applying for rebates 2.4 under the program to ensure compliance with program 2.5 requirements. 26 27 Section 2.
