1 Representative(s) Pickens offered the following: 2 Amendment (with title amendment) 3 Between line(s) 427 and 428 insert: 4 Subsections (1) and (7) of section 1013.62, 5 Section 8. 6 Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 7 1013.62 Charter schools capital outlay funding.--8 (1)In each year in which funds are appropriated for charter school capital outlay purposes, the Commissioner of 9 10 Education shall allocate the funds among eligible charter schools. To be eligible for a funding allocation, a charter 11 school must: 12 (a)1. Have been in operation for 3 or more years; 13 Be an expanded feeder chain of a charter school within 14 2. 15 the same school district that is currently receiving charter school capital outlay funds; or 16 535681

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17 3. Have been accredited by the Commission on Schools of18 the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

(b) Have financial stability for future operation as acharter school.

(c) Have satisfactory student achievement based on state
accountability standards applicable to the charter school.

(d) Have received final approval from its sponsor pursuantto s. 1002.33 for operation during that fiscal year.

(e) Serve students in facilities that are not provided bythe charter school's sponsor.

28 The first priority for charter school capital outlay funding

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shall be to allocate to the charter schools that received 29 funding in the 2005-2006 fiscal year an allocation of the same 30 31 amount per capital outlay full-time equivalent student up to the lesser of the actual number of capital outlay full-time 32 equivalent students in the current year or the capital outlay 33 full-time equivalent students in the 2005-2006 fiscal year. 34 After calculating the first priority, the second priority shall 35 36 be to allocate excess funds remaining in the appropriation in an amount equal to the per capital outlay full-time equivalent 37 student amount in the first priority calculation to eligible 38 charter schools not included in the first priority calculation 39 and to schools in the first priority calculation with growth in 40 excess of the 2005-2006 capital outlay full-time equivalent 41 students. After calculating the first and second priorities, 42 43 excess funds remaining in the appropriation shall be allocated to all eligible charter schools. A charter school's allocation 44 45 shall not exceed one-fifteenth of the cost per student station 535681

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46 specified in s. 1013.64(6)(b). Prior to the release of capital outlay funds to a school district on behalf of the charter 47 school, the Department of Education shall ensure that the 48 district school board and the charter school governing board 49 enter into a written agreement that includes provisions for the 50 51 reversion of any unencumbered funds and all equipment and property purchased with public education funds to the ownership 52 53 of the district school board, as provided for in subsection (3), in the event that the school terminates operations. Any funds 54 recovered by the state shall be deposited in the General Revenue 55 56 Fund. A charter school is not eligible for a funding allocation if it was created by the conversion of a public school and 57 58 operates in facilities provided by the charter school's sponsor for a nominal fee or at no charge or if it is directly or 59 indirectly operated by the school district. Unless otherwise 60 provided in the General Appropriations Act, the funding 61 allocation for each eligible charter school shall be determined 62 by multiplying the school's projected student enrollment by one-63 fifteenth of the cost-per-student station specified in s. 64 1013.64(6)(b) for an elementary, middle, or high school, as 65 appropriate. If the funds appropriated are not sufficient, the 66 67 commissioner shall prorate the available funds among eligible charter schools. However, no charter school or charter lab 68 school shall receive state charter school capital outlay funds 69 in excess of the one-fifteenth cost per student station formula 70 if the charter school's combination of state charter school 71 72 capital outlay funds, capital outlay funds calculated through the reduction in the administrative fee provided in s. 73 1002.33(20), and capital outlay funds allowed in s. 74 535681 4/4/2006 8:55:08 PM

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75 1002.32(9)(e) and (h) exceeds the one-fifteenth cost per student station formula. Funds shall be distributed on the basis of the 76 capital outlay full-time equivalent membership by grade level, 77 78 which shall be calculated by averaging the results of the second 79 and third enrollment surveys. The Department of Education shall 80 distribute capital outlay funds monthly, beginning in the first quarter of the fiscal year, based on one-twelfth of the amount 81 82 the department reasonably expects the charter school to receive during that fiscal year. The commissioner shall adjust 83 subsequent distributions as necessary to reflect each charter 84 85 school's actual student enrollment as reflected in the second and third enrollment surveys. The commissioner shall establish 86 87 the intervals and procedures for determining the projected and actual student enrollment of eligible charter schools. 88

89 (7) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, beginning in the 2003-2004 fiscal year: 90

(a) If the appropriation for charter school capital outlay 91 funds is no greater than the 2002 2003 appropriation, the funds 92 shall be allocated according to the formula outlined in 93 94 subsection (1) to:

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1. The same schools that received funding in 2002 2003. 96 2. Schools that are an expanded feeder pattern of schools that received funding in 2002 2003. 97

98 3. Schools that have an approved charter and are serving students at the start of the 2003 2004 school year and either 99 incurred long term financial obligations prior to January 31, 100 101 2003, or began construction on educational facilities prior to December 31, 2002. 102

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103 (b) If the appropriation for charter school capital outlay 104 funds is less than the 2002 2003 appropriation, the funds shall 105 be prorated among the schools eligible in paragraph (a).

106 (c) If the appropriation for charter school capital outlay 107 funds is greater than the 2002 2003 appropriation, the amount of funds provided in the 2002-2003 appropriation shall be allocated 108 according to paragraph (a). First priority for allocating the 109 110 amount in excess of the 2002-2003 appropriation shall be to 111 prorate the excess funds among the charter schools with longterm debt or long term lease to the extent that the initial 112 113 allocation is insufficient to provide one-fifteenth of the cost per student station specified in s. 1013.64(6)(b), and second 114 115 priority shall be to other eligible charter schools.
