80	board shall be replaced with a new member upon the expiration of
81	his or her term. The terms of all members appointed on or after
82	July 1, 2006, shall be for 3 years, and no such member may serve
83	more than two consecutive terms. Current members who have served
84	only one term may be appointed for a final 3-year term. The
85	initial terms of the members shall be as follows:
86	(a) Of the members appointed pursuant to paragraph (1)(a),
87	two shall be appointed for terms expiring June 30, 2005, one for
88	a term expiring June 30, 2004, and one for a term expiring June
