The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 20 21 security numbers, and photographs of active or former law 22 enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional 23 probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of 2.4 25 abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties 26 27 are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect, 2.8 and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local 29 governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home 30 addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 31
