15	Section 1. Paragraph (d) of subsection (4) of section
16	119.071, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

20	(d)1. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social
21	security numbers, and photographs of active or former law
22	enforcement personnel, including correctional and correctional
23	probation officers, personnel of the Department of Children
24	and Family Services whose duties include the investigation of
25	abuse, neglect, exploitation, fraud, theft, or other criminal
26	activities, personnel of the Department of Health whose duties
27	are to support the investigation of child abuse or neglect,
28	and personnel of the Department of Revenue or local
29	governments whose responsibilities include revenue collection
30	and enforcement or child support enforcement; the home
31	addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers,

The home 4 5 addresses, telephone numbers, and photographs of firefighters б certified in compliance with s. 633.35; the home addresses, 7 telephone numbers, photographs, and places of employment of 8 the spouses and children of such firefighters; and the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 9 the children of such firefighters are exempt from s. 10 119.07(1). The home addresses and telephone numbers of 11 12 justices of the Supreme Court, district court of appeal 13 judges, circuit court judges, and county court judges; the home addresses, telephone numbers, and places of employment of 14 the spouses and children of justices and judges; and the names 15 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 16 17 the children of justices and judges are exempt from s. 18 119.07(1). The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former state 19 attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, 20 21 or assistant statewide prosecutors; the home addresses, 22 telephone numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and 23 places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former state attorneys, assistant state attorneys, statewide 2.4 25 prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors; and the names 26 and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by 27 the children of current or former state attorneys, assistant 2.8 state attorneys, statewide prosecutors, or assistant statewide prosecutors are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I 29 30 of the State Constitution. 31

The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 2 security numbers, and photographs of current or former human resource, labor relations, or employee relations directors, 3 4 assistant directors, managers, or assistant managers of any 5 local government agency or water management district whose 6 duties include hiring and firing employees, labor contract 7 negotiation, administration, or other personnel-related 8 duties; the names, home addresses, telephone numbers, social 9 security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such personnel; and the names and 10 locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the 11 12 children of such personnel are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 13 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance 14 with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2006, 15 16 unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by 17 the Legislature. 3. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 18 security numbers, and photographs of current or former United 19 States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; the 20 21 home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 22 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and 23 children of current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys; and the names and locations 2.4 of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of 25 26 current or former United States attorneys and assistant United States attorneys are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), 27 2.8 Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject 29 to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 30 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless 31

The home addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, and photographs of current or former judges 4 of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district 5 6 judges, and United States magistrate judges; the home 7 addresses, telephone numbers, social security numbers, 8 photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of current or former judges of United States Courts 9 of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States 10 magistrate judges; and the names and locations of schools and 11 12 day care facilities attended by the children of current or 13 former judges of United States Courts of Appeal, United States district judges, and United States magistrate judges are 14 exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State 15 Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open 16 17 Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and 18 shall stand repealed on October 2, 2009, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 19 5. The home addresses, telephone numbers, social 20 21 security numbers, and photographs of current or former code 22 enforcement officers; the names, home addresses, telephone 23 numbers, social security numbers, photographs, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons; and 2.4 the names and locations of schools and day care facilities 25 26 attended by the children of such persons are exempt from s. 27 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. The home addresses, telephone numbers, places of 6 employment, and photographs of current or former guardians ad 7 litem, as defined in s. 39.820, and the names, home addresses, 8 telephone numbers, and places of employment of the spouses and children of such persons, are exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 9 10 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution, if the guardian ad litem provides a written statement that the guardian ad litem 11 12 has made reasonable efforts to protect such information from 13 being accessible through other means available to the public. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset 14 Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand 15 repealed on October 2, 2010, unless reviewed and saved from 16 17 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature. 18 7.
