Subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 14 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases 15 as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 16 17 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: (15)(a) Until October 1, 1978, "special risk member" 18 means any officer or employee whose application is approved by 19 the administrator and who receives salary payments for work 20 performed as a peace officer; law enforcement officer; police 2.1 22 officer; highway patrol officer; custodial employee at a 23 correctional or detention facility; correctional agency employee whose duties and responsibilities involve direct 2.4 contact with inmates, but excluding secretarial and clerical 25 26 employees; firefighter; or an employee in any other job in the 27 field of law enforcement or fire protection if the duties of 2.8 such person are certified as hazardous by his or her employer. (b) Effective October 1, 1978, "special risk member" 29 means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is 30 designated as a special risk member by the division in

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accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, or a correctional officer and must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515.

- (c) Effective October 1, 1999, "special risk member" means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is designated as a special risk member by the division in accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, a correctional officer, an emergency medical technician, or a paramedic and must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515.
- (d)1. Effective January 1, 2001, "special risk member" includes any member who is employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(e).
- 2. Effective January 1, 2001, "special risk member" includes any professional health care bargaining unit or non-unit member who is employed by the Department of Corrections or the Department of Children and Family Services and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(f).
- (e) Effective July 1, 2001, the term "special risk member" includes any member who is employed as a youth custody officer by the Department of Juvenile Justice and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(g).
- (f) Effective July 1, 2006, the term "special risk member" includes a person who is employed by the Department of Juvenile Justice as a juvenile detention officer, as a senior juvenile detention officer, or as the direct supervisor or command officer of these employees and who meets certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515.

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Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

121.0515 Special risk membership.--

- (2) CRITERIA. -- A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of a local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the

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Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 2 Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such 3 responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support 4 5 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, 7 legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further 8 provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or 9 10 command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special 11 12 risk contribution rate, shall be included;

- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;
- (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's

primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene 2 emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the 3 supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have 4 such responsibility. However, administrative support 5 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 8 personnel, shall not be included; 9 (e) The member must be employed as a community-based 10 correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, 11 12 the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the 13 supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or 14 community controllees within the community; or the member must 15 be the supervisor of a member or members who have such 16 17 responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, 18 but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal 19 services, and personnel management, shall not be included; 20 21 however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit 22 administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class; 23 (f) The member must be employed in one of the following classes and must spend at least 75 percent of his or 2.4 her time performing duties which involve contact with patients 25 26 or inmates in a correctional or forensic facility or 27 institution: 2.8 1. In addition, the member's primary 8 duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, 9 and counseling of assigned juveniles within the community; or 10 (h) The member must be employed by a law enforcement 11 12 agency or medical examiner's office in a forensic discipline 13 recognized by the International Association for Identification and must qualify for active membership in the International 14 Association for Identification. The member's primary duties 15 and responsibilities must include the collection, examination, 16 preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of 18 physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or 19 command officer of one or more individuals with such 20 21 responsibility. Administrative support personnel, including, 22 but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are 23 clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or. 2.4 (i) The member must be employed by the Department of 25 Juvenile Justice as a juvenile detention officer or a senior 26 27 juvenile detention officer and must be subject to training in compliance with s. 985.406. In addition, the member's primary 2.8 duties and responsibilities must be the supervision and 29 control of detainees in all activities, the maintenance or 30

assurance of the safe and secure custody of all assigned

2	of zero tolerance for detainee escapes, detainee abuse, sexual
